

ASSAULT CASE IS
BEING HEARD
THIS AFTERNOON

King vs. Harry Nevers on Information of Albert "Dutch" Lee Up For Hearing Today—Both Men Prominent In Harness Racing.

The case of the King vs Harry Nevers on information of Albert "Dutch" Lee, in which assault with intent to do grievous bodily harm is charged by the informant Lee, is being heard this afternoon at 2.15 o'clock in the local police court. J. J. F. Winslow K. C., is acting counsel for the informant, Albert Lee., J. Bacon Dickson is counsel for the defendant.

The assault charge arose over the affair which took place at the race track on the first day of the mid-summer races of the Fredericton Exhibition Limited on Wednesday. A dispute having arisen between the drivers, "Dutch" Lee and Harry Nevers as the 2.16 Trot and Pace was being run off, Lee was making his way to the judges stand to voice a protest. Nevers coming up behind Lee struck him a severe blow over the head with the butt of his whip, bringing blood. A fight ensued and the two rolled over and over on the track in fierce battle until they were separated by nearby witnesses.

The immediate action of the racing committee was to place a suspension and a fine on Nevers. Lee, however issued a warrant against Nevers, charging assault and the latter was arrested and hearing set for this morning at 10 o'clock. It was however postponed until this afternoon when it was thought it would be more convenient for the parties involved. The defendant in the case was previously let out on \$1,000 bail \$500 himself and local sureties of \$250 each. "Dutch" Lee is a driver for the Reed stable at Fort Fairfield, Me., while Nevers is from Houlton, Me.

The case of King on information of Albert "Dutch" Lee vs Harry Nevers Houlton race driver, who was arrested on warrant issued by Lee on a charge of assault following a dispute in which Lee was badly cut about the head by Nevers' whip in the races on Wednesday last, came up for hearing this afternoon before Police Magistrate Limerick and the defendant was allowed out on suspended sentence. J. J. F. Winslow K. C., was counsel for the informant while J. Bacon Dickson acted in this capacity for the defendant. Harry Nevers. A hint as to civil charges being made was not followed up and they were dropped.
