- 1 1-2 cups granulated sugar 3 eggs, well beaten
- 3 squares chocolate melited
- 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup flour
- 1-4 teaspoon salt
- 6 tablespoons milk
- 1 cup coarsely chopped nut meats

Cream Largarine add sugar, eggs hocolate and vanilla. Best well, mix flour and salt and add alternately with milk to first mixture Stir in nuts. Bake 25 minutes at 350 degrees F. Recipe fits pan 12 by 8 and 34 inches. If hard brownies are preferred, bake 10 minutes longer; cool a lithte and cut in bars
