Rich visitors from Europe and America who come to this northern corner of Africa for sun and sea air soon find themselves gently insinuated into the desert. Every hotel is full of exquisitely beautiful posters accentuating the lure of the desert. Hotel managers and Arab guides whisper of its glories, and one morning you find yourself in one of the most comfortable of autocars and your luggage stowed in a trailer behind.

All the Comforts of Home

Instinctively every woman packs her smartest clothes in the desert luggage; she has been told they will be useful at the smart hotels to which

they will be taken. The first six hours out, when the finds she left her lipstick behind, she is relieved to see in an Arab village on the road an assortment of cosmetics and perfumes worthy of Bond Street and Fifth Avenue.

The cars themselves lull you into a delightful coma. Ice water tinkles in a carafe near by—ice water in the desert!

At lunch time, right in the desert, a caravan of cars pulls up at a French-Arab hotel where delicious food and Algerian wines demoralize the visitor from strenuous places like London or New York.

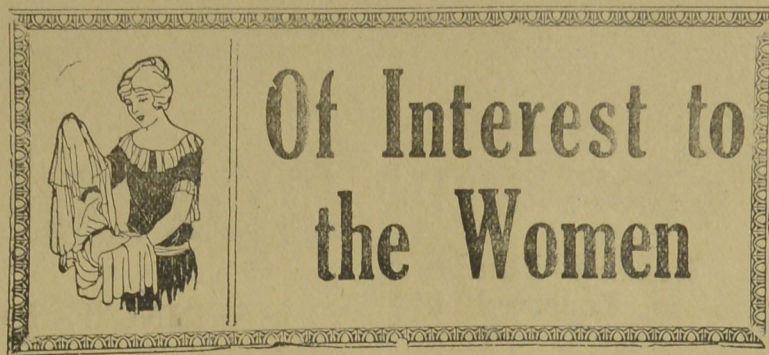

CREOLE CAKE.

1-2 cup butter
2 cups brown sugar
3 eggs
1-3 cup cocoa
1-2 cup strong coffee infusion
1 teaspoon soda
2 cups flour
1-2 cup sour cream or milk
Cream butter and gradually beat in the sugar. Then add egg yolks beaten until thick. Add coffee infusion gradually to cocoa and let stand until cool. Add to first mixture, then add cream and flour sifted with soda. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Bake in layer cake tins in a moderate oven (375 degrees Fahrenheit) about twenty minutes. Put layers together with boiled icing cover top with icing and when set spread with a thin layer of chocolate, melted. One cup of chopped nuts and one cup of raisins may be added to make a chocolate fruit cake.

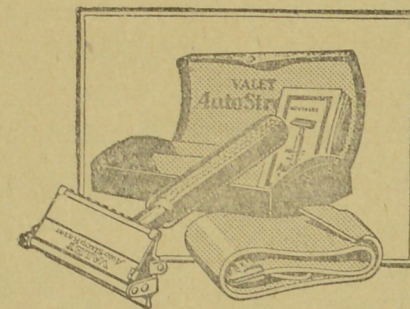
