

HARD SURFACING PROGRAM FOR THE COMING SUMMER

Minister Public Works Calls Tenders for Paving Eight Sections

Asphaltic Concrete

Total of 68.8 Miles N. B. Highways To Be Built of Concrete-Cement

Tenders for the construction of 68.8 miles of hard surfaced highway were called today by Hon. D. A. Stewart, Minister of Public Works.

The announcement calls for alternative tenders on Asphaltic Concrete Pavement with Sheet Asphalt Wearing Surface or Portland Cement Concrete Pavement. In cases where the Asphaltic Concrete is indicated, the tendered prices will be made to provide for pavement twenty feet in width and four inches total thickness. The Portland Cement Concrete Pavement would also be laid to a width of twenty feet, 2 x 10 foot strips each with thickened edges, 9 x 6 x 9 inch cross sections.

The new paving undertakings will provide employment in various sections of the Province. There will be in all eight jobs. Five of these will be on Trans-Canada Highway No. 2 at points along its length from the Quebec Boundary to the Nova Scotia Boundary. No. 1 Highway, St. Stephen to Saint John, will have two stretches of hard surfacing one near St. Andrews and the other near Saint John. The eighth will be near Richardsville on Highway No. 11.

Harold McMurray, chairman of the migratory bird committee, gave information which he had received from the Saskatchewan Association relative to the drive on crows. The objective in the west this year is a million crows and a million eggs. Last year the members of the local association had killed 700 crows. It is planned to hold May 24 as the date for such a drive hereabouts, and prizes will be offered for killing crows. W. K. Hay, president, was in the chair.

COMMITTEES TO ARRANGE FOR MAY 6 CELEBRATION APPOINTED AT SPECIAL MEETING LAST NIGHT

Representative Committee of City Met Last Night and Had Interesting Meeting—Patriotic Films, Parade of Decorated Floats, Royal Salute, Ball, Lighting of Beacon, etc., for the Celebration.

At a busy meeting last evening of the city of Fredericton's representative general committee which will arrange for the provincial celebration in this city on May 6 of the King's silver jubilee celebration, appointments of the various committees were made. Ald. C. Hedley Forbes, chairman of the general committee presided.

Program Outlined

The meeting last evening resulted in considerable discussion on just what form the celebration will take. The celebration was outlined clearly and will be carried out, dependent upon the amount of funds at the disposal of the committee. The committees named will meet each week.

Among other things it is planned to have a free motion picture show of films of patriotic nature for the school children. The pictures will be shown at both theatres on the morning of May 6, and flags will be distributed among the children. The afternoon will be taken up with a monster parade, including decorated floats, automobiles and bicycles. An amount of \$153 will be set aside for prizes. A Royal Salute will be fired in the early afternoon of that day. It was understood at the meeting that most of the organizations in the city would contribute floats to the parade.

A Formal Ball

One of the features will be the lighting of a beacon in the early twilight, the local Boy Scout Association looking after this part of the entertainment. This step is in conjunction with the dominion-wide chain of beacons to be lighted on that day. The Boy Scouts also will raise flags on public buildings. Another thing suggested is a garrison church parade on Sunday morning.

A formal ball will be held at the parliament buildings on the evening of May 6 and will be one of the most colorful ever held in the capital. Visitors from all parts of the province will be here for the event. The proceeds of this ball will go towards the jubilee cancer fund.

Among other events for the evening of May 6 there will be addresses from several public men, these to be broadcast and specially amplified.

Marysville and Devon have been invited to participate in the celebration and the Indians of French Village will be asked to take part in the parade in the afternoon.

A number of visits had been made to the homes for the same purpose. At the Well-Baby Conference, 252 babies had been present, fourteen were new and thirteen were referred to old physicians. In this city the Ministering Circle of the King's Daughter had served tea, and in Devon the ladies of St. Anthony's church had served tea. Notice was given of the general meeting of the Victorian Order which will be held in Ottawa on May 1.

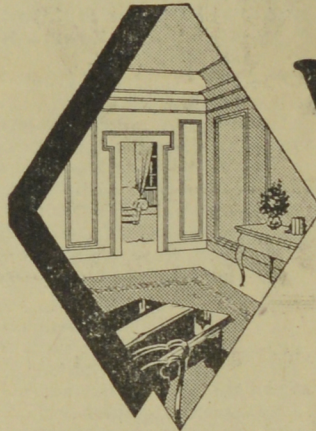
ASSAULT CHARGE

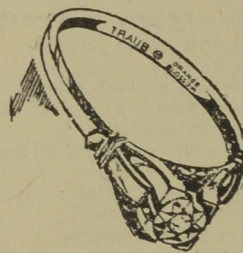

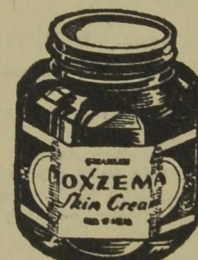
