

NEW GOVERNOR CONGRATULATED BY LARGE NUMBER

Hon. Dr. Murray MacLaren, Gets Tokens From Other Govs.

Swearing-in Ceremony Witnessed by Large Assemblage

New Brunswick's new lieutenant governor, Hon. Dr. Murray MacLaren, C.M.G., who was sworn in at a special ceremony here yesterday has been the recipient of hundreds of congratulations, among them being one from the lieutenant governor's of Prince Edward Island and Quebec, one from Lieut. Col. Hon. D. M. Sutherland, D.S.O., minister of pensions and national health in the federal cabinet, and one from Major General Hugh H. McLean, former lieutenant governor of this province.

Lieutenant Governor MacLaren has also received letters from His Worship Mayor W. G. Clark, and congratulatory letters from the towns of Chatham and Campbellton and the city of Moncton. He has received, too, a large number of personal messages from all parts of Canada. Mrs. MacLaren has been presented with a beautiful bouquet of flowers, the gift of the provincial government, and she also received felicitations from friends here and in other parts of Canada.

The gallery in the Legislative Assembly chamber was filled yesterday when the ceremony of swearing in the new lieutenant governor commenced. Among others present were Mrs. MacLaren and daughter, Miss Margaret MacLaren. In the absence of E. J. Lemaire, clerk of the privy council of Canada, who had originally been slated to present the commission, H. Lester Smith, clerk of the executive council, was delegates to act for him.

Mrs. John King Hazen Celebrates Her 97th Birthday Today

Sir Douglas is Son

Descendant of Loyalist Stock Nears Century Mark of Life

Today at her home in Brunswick street where she resides with her granddaughter, Mrs. John King Hazen, mother of Sir J. Douglas Hazen, retired chief justice of New Brunswick, is quietly celebrating her 97th birthday and is receiving the congratulations of her many friends.

Mrs. Hazen, who is one of the most highly regarded and most venerable ladies in this province was born in this city and has spent the greater part of her life here. She is the daughter of the late Hon. John A. Beckwith, one of the early mayors of this city, and formerly provincial secretary of New Brunswick. The late ex-major Harry Beckwith, C. W. Beckwith, former city clerk; and the late A. G. Beckwith, former chief engineer of the provincial government were brothers.

The Fredericton woman has only one son, Sir Douglas Hazen. Her daughter, Mrs. George Allen died last year. She has twelve great grandchildren and the grandchildren include D. King Hazen, K.C., of Saint John; Mrs. Malcolm McKay of Saint John; Mrs. McCauley of Montreal; the late Mrs. McAvity of Saint John; and Miss Hazen Allen with whom she lives.

In her earlier life Mrs. Hazen showed considerable talent as an artist, and in 1867 at the local exhibition she exhibited a collection of paintings on the wild flowers of New Brunswick, which won high praise for its original treatment. In this connection Mrs. Hazen had studied at the Boston Art School.

Her grandfather, Nehemiah Douglas, was one of the early Loyalists and her grandmother, Marie Duplissy Lebrun who was of French extraction came here with Mrs. Carleton the wife of Governor Carleton. Her other grandmother, was the daughter of Peter Berton, also a Loyalist.

Mrs. J.-Brown Maxwell and Mrs. Arthur Gibson, of this city are nieces of Mrs. Allen.

Mrs. Hazen is at present enjoying fairly good health and is up every afternoon, receiving her friends often. She had been sick for a time but has recovered and is now enjoying reasonably good health and is keenly alive to the day's happenings.

BIG MARKET TODAY

Today's market at Phoenix Square was a very large one with a great number of farmers in and prices about as on Wednesday. Wood was very much in evidence with the price ranging from \$5 to \$8 per cord. Other prices were as follows: Chicken, 25 cents per pound; fowl, 17 cents per pound; beef, 4 to 7 cents per pound; pork, 10 to 12 cents per pound; butter 25 cents per pound; lamb, 14 to 17 cents per pound; wood, \$8 per cord, potatoes, 75 cts. per barrel.

SHIPMENTS OF DRESSED BEEF FROM PROVINCE

Farmers in North Find Ready Market in Eastern United States

Duty No Handicap

Farmers Find It Great Help in These Days of Depression

Although carried out on a small scale many farmers in the northern counties of this province, have in recent weeks been shipping dressed beef to the Eastern United States—and making a profit out of it!

The duty of 5 cents on every pound seems to be no serious handicap and the farmers have been getting twelve cents per pound for their beef.

The fact that Eastern United States producers lost thousands of cattle in the drought of last summer has made it possible for the New Brunswick farmer to edge a way into that market. Recently there has been quite a scarcity of beef in that part of America.

Farmers in the local markets only get five and six cents per pound for their produce but those in the northern counties find that there is more profit to be made by shipments to the United States market, where they secure twelve cents per pound for their product. While such a business can only be carried out on a small scale,

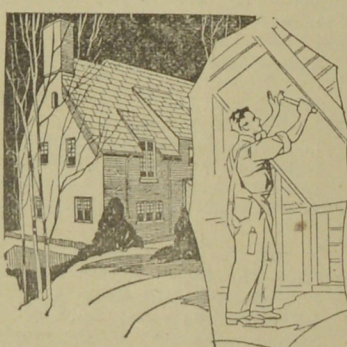

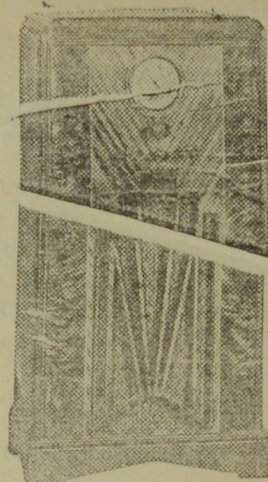

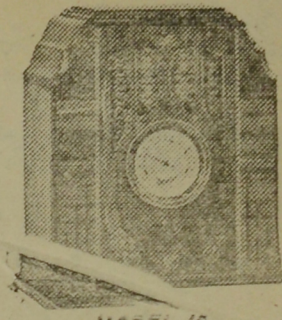
