DIES AS RESULT OF AUTO CRASH IN WESTERN CANADA

A. S. F. Rankine, Former Well Known Traveller, Dies in Coast Province

Old timers in this city will regret to learn of the death at New Westminster, B. C., a short time ago, as the result of injuries sustained in an auto accident of A. S. F. Rankine, a former well known commercial traveller. He represented the Brayley wholesale drug concern of Montreal, and was a frequent visitor to Fredericton.

Six and a half feet tall, he was a striking figure and attracted much attention on the streets. In 1898 he resigned his position and joined the rush to the Yukon gold fields, but with what success his friends were never informed. He handled war supplies during the Russian-Japanese war and afterwards engaged in cattle ranching in the west. Of late years he made his headquarters in Vancouver, B. C.

The late Mr. Rankine was quite well known in this city and his passing will be learned with general regret. Many persons in this city remember him for his kindness of habits and disposition.

FOUR TO SPEAK IN WIND-UP OF DEBATE TUESDAY

Quiet Week-end, With Members All Away; Budget Soon

The New Brunswick Legislature will enter upon its second full week tomorrow and will wind-up the Debate on the Address with a flurry of four speakers. Those who will speak will be F. W. Pirie, G. W. Perry, W. S. Anderson, and A. J. Brooks. The latter is expected to wind-up the debate. Tonight a delegation will arrive in the city from Chatham and will present a petition to the government respecting a rayon mill in that vicinity. Rev. Dr. Williams, of Boiestown, is one of the delegation.

Tomorrow there will be another night session, according to present plans. Routine business is expected to occupy the attention of the House from Tuesday to Thursday and the budget will probably be brought down on Friday. The House will get down to real serious business as soon as the budget is introduced.

Premier Tilley was the only member of the Legislature who remained in the capital over the week-end, the others leaving for their homes. These will return to the city tonight.

SAD DEATH OF MRS. ABNER B. BELYEA, SHORT ILLNESS

Well Known Lady Only Ill For a Week With Pneumonia—News Came As a Shock To Friends On Sunday.

The sympathy of all those acquainted with Mr. and Mrs. Abner B. Belyea and family will go out to them in the death of Mrs. Belyea at her home on Grey Street. Mrs. Belyea passed away on Saturday night after only a week's illness from pneumonia. The announcement came over the radio on Sunday when it was announced at the Brunswick Street Baptist Church service. It was heard with feelings of the very greatest regret. The death of this comparatively young woman who leaves besides her husband, a little son just starting to school is a particularly sad one.

Mrs. Belyea was a daughter of the late Charles Gatecombe. She was born in this city and resided here all her life and had a large circle of friends. She is survived by her husband and one little boy Kevin. Six sisters also survive. They are Mrs. Leon Thurott, Mrs. Warren W. Maxwell, Misses Marjorie and Shirley Gatecombe, of this city, and Mrs. Earl Mott and Miss Hilda Gatecombe of Worcester, Mass.

The funeral will take place tomorrow (Tuesday) afternoon at 2.30 o'clock. Service will be conducted at the home on Grey Street by Rev. G. W. Gulou, pastor of the Brunswick Street Baptist Church assisted by Rev. W. C. Kierstead. Interment will be at the Rural Cemetery.

WANTS DISTRICT NURSE FOR RURAL BOIESTOWN AREA

Rev. Fr. Williams, Doctor, Priest and Lawyer, To Submit Case

Conditions Bad

People in Rural Districts Without Knowledge or Material for Sickness

Rev. Dr. R. J. Williams, parish priest at Boiestown, is here, to put a proposition to the Department of Public Health regarding the securing of a District Nurse, who would serve Boiestown, Taxis River and the parish of Ludlow and the surrounding districts. He has been in communication with Dr. Hewitt, of the St. John Public Hospital in regard to having nurses especially prepared for nurses in rural districts, where there are no doctors. There would probably be no expense for transportation, except to the residents, who would transport the nurse to places where she was required to go. It would be worked on the same plan as would the V.O.N. in the cities. It would be necessary to have a one year's course in public health. The purpose is to insure better health in rural districts. This plan is already in effect in Campobello, St. Martins and other places.

Rev. Dr. Williams, the promoter, is a medical doctor and a lawyer, as well as a priest. He has often walked twelve miles into the woods and found people who had no knowledge or material to fight sickness.
