

### U. N. B. ENCAENIA NEARS STUDENTS WRITING EXAMS.

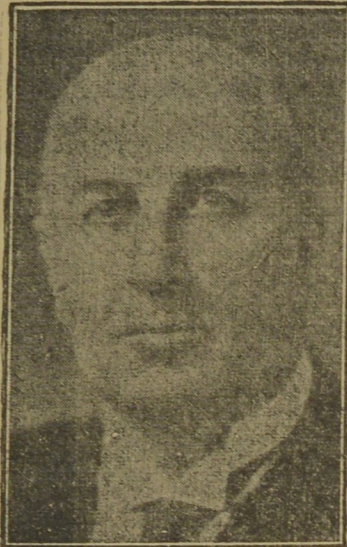
Baccalaureate Sermon

### ELEVEN NURSES WERE GRADUATED FROM VICTORIA PUBLIC HOSPITAL HERE ON THURSDAY EVENING

The Young Lady Graduates Completed An Excellent Course of Training—Inspiring and Encouraging Addresses Were Delivered by Very Rev. Dean Holmes, Rev. J. W. Bartlett, Mayor Clark, Mrs. A. L. Gerow and Others—Dr. G. C. Vanwart Gave Interesting History of Hospital Founded by Lady Tilley in 1887.

The graduating exercises of the Victoria Public Hospital Training School for Nurses were held last evening in the auditorium of the High School. The hall was filled to capacity and the programme a most interesting one. The stage was beautifully decorated with tall palms which with the pleasing contrast of the dainty nurses' uniforms on the stage and throughout the rooms and the corridors created a pleasing setting.

Promptly at eight o'clock to the strains of the Grand March played by Miss Almada Miller the graduates and Mrs. Stella Woodcock, superintendent, marched in and took their places on the platform. J. A. Reid, former mayor, and chairman of the Hospital Board, was in the chair and after opening remarks called upon Rev. J. W. Bartlett for the Prayer. This was followed by a few words of congratulations from His Worship Mayor W. G. Clark on behalf of the City of Fredericton, with words of sound advice to the eleven graduates of the evening. His Worship also stressed the needs of radium in the institution in order to place it on a par with any other hospital in Canada.

Mrs. A. L. Gerow was next heard in several short readings in her usual pleasing style. These numbers included short poems which were very appropriate. Mrs. Gerow concluded with words of advice to the class.

Dr. G. C. VanWart, after congratulating the graduating class, went into a brief history of Victoria Public Hospital. Dr. VanWart, who has been connected with the institution since its inception, gave a vivid and interesting picture of the hospital from its very beginning. The first name was the Victoria Cottage hospital. On the twenty-first of June in 1887, imbued with the desire of doing something for the community, Lady Tilley, wife of Lieutenant Governor Sir Leonard Tilley and mother of the present Premier of New Brunswick, Hon. L. P. D. Tilley, founded the first hospital. Dr. VanWart remembers vividly the laying of the corner stone for the building which was formally opened in 1888.

Lady Tilley was first patroness and treasurer. Hon. A. G. Blair, then Premier of New Brunswick, was the first president of the Hospital Board, the treasurer being L. W. Johnson. The first matron was Miss McAllum with the Misses Ogilvie on the staff. Later a contagious ward was endowed by Asa Dow of Meductic, York Co. The first training school was established in 1896. In 1902 an ambulance was donated by the Hon. A. FitzRandolph. Seeing the growing need of an X-ray machine, Dr. VanWart in humorous chat told the audience how on a hot day a base ball match was held in Scully's Grove to raise funds for the purchase of an X-ray. \$400 was raised which paid for the first X-ray in the Maritimes, the technician being the late George N. Babbitt.

Great benefactors, including the late Donald Fraser, Henry D. Yerxa of Boston, the Hospital Aid and other sources had made it possible to add improvements to the hospital. Dr. VanWart would like to see a larger maternity building erected. He also stated that the graduates of the training school always do well, this being
