The pie was attractively arranged on a silver plate and was awarded an honourable mention.

#### Cranberry Pie

2 cups water  
4 teaspoons flour  
1 cup sugar  
Pinch of salt  
Cook until clear.  
Add 1 cup raisins  
1½ cups cranberries, cut in two and washed in collander to remove some of the seeds.

#### Pie Crust

1 cup pastry flour  
1-3 cup shortening  
Pinch of salt  
Enough cold water to hold mixture together.  
Line pie plate, add filling, criss-cross pie with pastry. Cook 30 minutes in oven at 450 degrees F.

Hallowed Eats of Hallowe'en

Are you having a Hallowe'en party this year? There's nothing any more fun than a party on Hallowe'en, even if it does mean pumpkin seeds around the kitchen and extra 'ghost' sheets for the laundry.

The holiday can best be observed by serving the hallow'd eats of Hallowe'en; doughnuts, spiced cider, pop corn, pulled molasses candy and apples-on-sticks. Pumpkins are indispensable, not only for grinning lanterns, but because their delicious filling makes grand Hallowe'en pies, and better yet, individual pumpkin tarts which may be given expressive faces with whipped cream piped through a pastry tube.

#### A Hallowe'en Hunt

Cut from cardboard an many black cats as there are players. Cut each cat into as many pieces as clues, and write each clue upon a piece of the cardboard cat. Number the pieces. Instruct the players that they are to bring back the pieces of the cat with them, and the first to assemble the whole cat gets the "treasure." This can be played indoors or out, by children or grown-ups.
