

## PREMIER WILL TAKE PART IN HUGE BROADCAST

With Other Premiers to Greet Rt. Hon. MacKenzie King

October 8th

Only Broadcast of Kind Ever Attempted in Canada

Hon. A. A. Dysart, premier and minister of lands and mines, will participate in a monster Liberal rally in Maple Leaf Gardens, Toronto, on Tuesday, October 8, when he, with the other seven Liberal premiers of the Dominion will speak over a nationwide hookup greeting Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, Liberal leader, who with other Canadian notables will occupy the platform at the Maple Leaf Gardens.

The various premiers will speak from their own provinces and as their addresses are heard in Toronto, a massive photograph of the premier who is speaking will be thrown on a huge screen before the audience. Hon. Vincent Massey will preside at the meeting. A broadcast of this kind has never before been attempted in Canada and it promises to be one of the greatest achievements of Canadian radio speaking.

Among those who will accompany the Liberal leader on the platform are Mrs. Charles H. Thorburn, O.B.E., and Hon. Mitchell F. Hepburn, premier of Ontario, who recently was in Fredericton. Premier Hepburn will deliver his message of greeting from the platform of the Maple Leaf Gardens while the other premiers who will speak by radio are as follows: Hon. T. D. Pattullo, British Columbia; Hon. James G. Gardiner, Saskatchewan; Hon. John Bracken, Manitoba; Hon. L. A. Taschereau, Quebec; Hon. A. A. Dysart, New Brunswick; Hon. Angus Macdonald, Nova Scotia; and Hon. Walter Lea, Prince Edward Island. As each extends his greetings and message he will be visualized in a large portrait flashed upon a screen.

## NEW HEALTH DISTRICT IS NOW FORMED

There Are Now Five Health Districts in the Province

New Officer

Dr. A. M. Clark, Woodstock, Appointed New Health Officer

A new health district in the province has been formed making the total number of districts five now instead of four, it was announced today by Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts, minister of public health and labor, in The Royal Gazette. The new district will be formed as a result of the division of the Western district into two districts, one to be known as the Central district and the other as the Western district. The Western district which formerly comprised the sub-districts of Sunbury, York, Fredericton, Carleton and Victoria, will now only take in Sunbury, York and Fredericton, while the Central district will take in Carleton and Victoria. This change will lessen the territory to be covered by the present Western district medical health officer, Dr. J. M. Cameron, and will increase the efficiency of the health service.

The new district health officer for the central district is Dr. A. M. Clarke, of Woodstock, who will make his headquarters at Lakeville, Carleton county. Dr. Clarke has been with the department of health for the past two or three years as tuberculosis diagnostician, and last year took a course in public health at the Toronto University school of hygiene, securing a diploma in that work. He was born in Northumberland county and has been connected with the medical profession for many years. Several years ago he took post graduate work in the Old Country and is a well known medical authority throughout the province. His appointment took effect on September 1st.

## Potato Payments Made Jointly To Growers, Banks

All payments made for potatoes purchased from growers who have received credit assistance under the legislation twenty-five George Fifth, chapter nine of the acts of 1935, shall be made by cheque or such other negotiable documents as shall be approved by the province and acceptable to the banks, it was announced today by Hon. A. C. Taylor, minister of Agriculture, in the Royal Gazette. The minister's announcement also stated that the payments shall be payable jointly to the bank advancing the loan and the grower receiving the loan.

Sales of potatoes may be made through recognized market channels but the Minister of Agriculture reserves the right to designate the agencies through which potatoes may or may not be sold by growers who have received credit assistance for the purchase of fertilizer. This regulation becomes null and void when the grower has paid the loan in full with interest, the announcement stated.

Rev. Milton Burt, who has been on an evangelistic tour of Maine, New Hampshire and Massachusetts for the past month, has taken over his duties as pastor of the Advent Christian Church, Devon. Rev. Mr. Burt is well known by the older residents of this community, having been pastor of the same church twenty years ago, and many of his old friends here welcome him back. He succeeds Edward Rebmann, student pastor, who resigned recently, to take a course of study in the New England School of Theology in Roxbury, Mass.

## 4 COUNCILLORS DEFEATED IN SUNBURY VOTE

Four Also Elected by Acclamation in Two Parishes

Fourteen On Council

Keen Interest Taken in Voting at Polls Yesterday

Four councillors were defeated as the people of Sunbury county went to the polls yesterday in the municipal election in that county. Voting at the various polls was carried out in good order and when the ballots were counted a close contest was revealed in which a larger percentage of the voters took part than in the previous election. The vanquished councillors are Councillor Alexander W. Burnett who was defeated in the parish of Burton by George W. White, Oromocto, and Tolbert Carr, Geary; Councillor Vivian Pond, who was turned out in Manguerville by Osborne Sewell; Councillor Harry Rowan who was beaten in Lincoln by Charles Peabody; and Councillor Fred Fowler, who was defeated in Northfield by Dr. Gordon R. Lawson and Dell Welton.

The full results of the election are as follows:

Parish of Gladstone—L. A. Hoyt, Fredericton Junction, and Councillor M. E. Phillips, Tracy, elected; T. E. Nason, Fredericton Junction, defeated.

Burton—George W. White, Oromocto, and Tolbert Carr, Geary, elected; Councillor Alexander W. Burnett, defeated.

Manguerville—Councillor Donald Bridges and Osborne Sewell, both of Manguerville, elected; Councillor Vivian Pond and George Day, defeated.

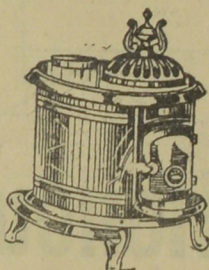

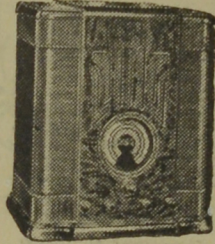
