

LUMBERING IN NEW BRUNSWICK IS ADVANCING

Use of Trucks in Hauling Speeds Up Woods Operations

Much Hardwood

First Shipment of Hardwood to Leave Saint John on Feb. 15th

The lumbering operations in the province have been proceeding under ideal conditions for the past few weeks and hauling and yarding have been progressing most satisfactorily. Although the operators have not had as much snow this winter as last, conditions at the first of the year looked good owing to the heavy snowfalls. But, if the snow holds off for a few weeks, the cuts of most of the operators will exceed those of last year.

The conditions for making good hauling roads have been so good that many of the operators have been able to use trucks all the year. The use of motor trucks for hauling has speeded up operations and to date yarding in most camps has advanced to a further stage than it had at the same time in 1933-34.

Hardwood

Hardwood is holding the spotlight in the operations this year, possibly owing to the stability of the price, while the price of softwood lumber is off a little from last year. The fact that so many operators are concentrating on cutting hardwood for export is liable to have an important effect on the price of softwood lumber next year. There will, no doubt be a greater demand for the latter in 1935-36.

The first shipment of hardwood billed for England will leave St. John on the 15th of February.

He was first elected to the House in 1896 as an opponent of the Blair government, and had for a colleague on the opposition benches Mr. John Black, barrister of this city. It is said that they are the only survivors of the House returned in that year. Mr. Lockhart before entering the Legislature served in the Saint John Common Council. The late Wesley Hoyt, for many years collector of customs at McAdam, was his brother-in-law.

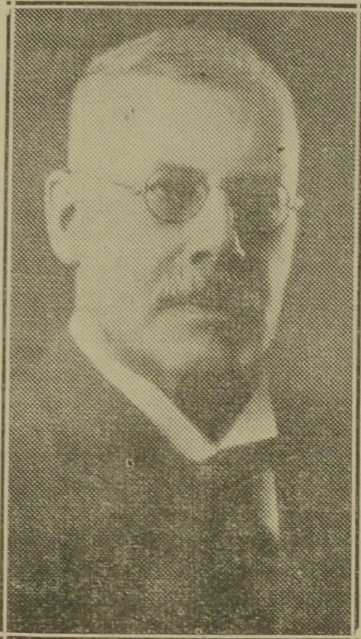
NEW LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR TO BE SWORN-IN FRIDAY

Glamorous Ceremony To Take Place in Assembly Chamber at 3.30

Members to be Re-sworn

Opening of Legislature To Take Place Next Thursday

Hon. Dr. Murray McLaren will arrive here Friday to be formally appointed Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick. The ceremony will take place in

the Assembly Chamber of the Legislative Building at 3.30 o'clock Friday afternoon.

Chief Justice J. B. M. Baxter will administer the oath following which the members of the government will be re-sworn. The re-swearing of the members of the government is a customary procedure when a lieutenant governor takes office.

Opening of Legislature

The district orders contain instructions with regard to the military ceremony at the opening of the New Brunswick Legislature, February 14.

A guard of honor to the lieutenant-governor will be furnished by the University of New Brunswick Contingent, C.O.T.C., and the band of the York Regiment is detailed for duty with the guard.

A salute of 15 guns will be given on the arrival of the lieutenant-governor at the Legislative Building by a detachment of the 90th Field Battery, C.A. This detachment will consist of one officer, one battery sergeant-major, four sergeants, four bombardiers and 16 gunners. A medical officer will attend the firing of the salute. Officers of the active and reserve militia are invited to attend the opening of the legislature. Officers lacking full dress may wear either "Blues" or khaki, with medals, tan gloves, Sam Browne belt and sword in leather scabbard.

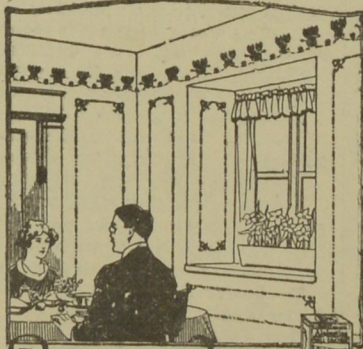

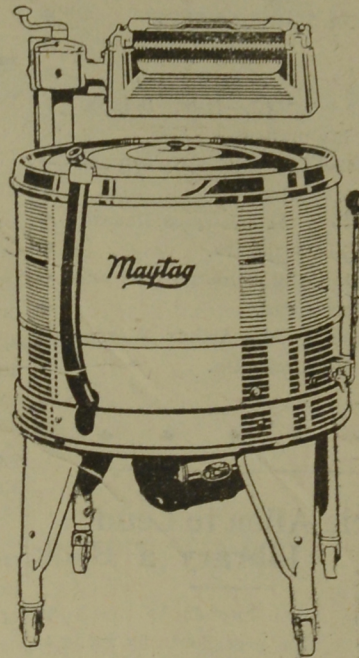
