been progressing most satisfactorily. Although the operators have not had as much snow this winter as last, conditions at the first of the year looked lead owing to the heavy snowfalls. But, of the snow holds off for a few weeks, the cuts of most of the operators will exceed those of last year.

The conditions for making good hauling roads have been so good that many of the operators have been able we use trucks all the year. The use of motor trucks for hauling has speeded mp operations and to date yarding in mest camps has advanced to a further stage than it had at the same time in 1933-34.

Hardwood is holding the spotlight in the operations this year, possibly wing to the stability of the price, while the price of softwood lumber is off a little from last year. The fact that so many operators are concentrating on cutting hardwood for export is liable to have an important effect en the price of softwood lumber next year. There will, no doubt be a greator demand for the latter in 1935-36.


