

LONDON'S MILES OF ILLUMINATIONS ON JUBILEE DAY

Compilations of News-reels and Special Productions Review Salient Incidents of Reign of King George V.

LONDON, May 1.—St. Paul's Cathedral, it is expected, will be floodlit as a part of the magnificent scheme of Jubilee illumination in Central London and the West End.

The plans are on a scale that will eclipse anything ever attempted previously in the art of illumination.

On May 6, and in the following fortnight, there will be floodlighting at the Bank, in the Strand, Whitehall, Parliament-square, Trafalgar-square, and at many points in the West End. Floodlighting effects are being installed at Buckingham Palace, Queen Victoria Memorial, St. James' Palace, Big Ben, Horse Guards, National Gallery, County Hall, Middlessex Guildhall Mansion House, Royal Exchange, Duchy of Lancaster new edifices, Africa House, Incorporated Accountants' Hall, Institution Temple Hall, and Town Hall, Marlyebone.

Hotels and Offices

The interior of Westminster Hall is to be flooded in order to display the glories of the mediaeval roof.

Many of the big hotels and the headquarters of great commercial firms in the West End will also be brilliantly illuminated.

The equipment for floodlighting Buckingham Palace, Big Ben, the Horse Guards Parade, and the National Gallery is to be permanent—as a Silver Jubilee gift from the electricity industry—so that it will be available on any future occasion at the discretion of the Office of Works.

Ten Landaus

It is announced today that the Royal procession from Buckingham Palace to St. Paul's on Jubilee Day will consist of ten State landaus.

The King and Queen will travel in an open landau drawn by six of the famous Windsor greys. The last time these horses were used was when the Duke and Duchess of Kent drove from Buckingham Palace to Paddington Station to begin their honeymoon last November.

The other nine carriages will each be drawn by four bay horses from the Royal Mews. In them will be the Royal Princess, members of the Royal Family, the Prime Minister, the Dominion's Premiers and others.

Order of the Garter May Admit Women

are for men. So is the Order of Merit.

Among "those whom the King de-lighteth to honour" in recognition of his Jubilee will be many women. Some of those already admitted to the Order of the British Empire may be advanced in degree, and new Companions will be made.

Though imperial and political merit will be remembered, the Royal favor will be accorded principally to those who have rendered personal service to the King and to his House.

For men, the appropriate honor is admission to the Royal Victorian Order, which was instituted by Queen Victoria for this express purpose. The statutes, however, contain no provision for the admission of women.

O. B. E. Unsuitable

It is possible that, to mark the Jubilee, the King may consider extending this Order to include women.

Nothing has yet been decided, but it is considered that the Order of the British Empire is hardly suitable, while the Companions of Honor are limited by statute to 50.

The Crown of India, of course, is purely in recognition of work in India.
