**"Donkey King" Restored To Throne In Ramsgate**

RAMSGATE, England, May 1—A king was deposed here, but after 100 loyal followers petitioned Ramsgate Council he has been given back his kingdom. The sovereign is John Todd, Donkey-ride King of Ramsgate sands for 60 years.

Recently a newcomer to the sands offered the council a higher tender for the right to give donkey rides along the sands, and the council accepted it. Then it was known that unless the petition sent in by the townsmen was heeded "King John" would lose his kingdom and his song would be jobless.

Mr. Todd was faced with the prospect of having to sell his donkeys, all of whom are great friends of his and of the children of Ramsgate. But help came, and he found he had only taken a short vacation after all.

**Buckingham Gold Plate Too Costly for Feast**

LONDON, May 1—Guests at a state banquet in Buckingham Palace May 6 in honor of the King's Jubilee will not eat off the King's famous gold dinner service after all.

It has been decided that the service, which with the rise in the price of gold is now worth approximately \$16,000,000, is too valuable to risk its getting scratched. Instead it will be placed on exhibition in the banquet hall for the guests to admire while dining off more prosaic china.

**World Community Is Only Peace Key, South Africans Told**

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, May 1—A world commonwealth is visualized by Lionel Curtis, one-time editor of the Round Table, and one of the delegates to the Imperial Press Conference in South Africa.

"Everyone seems to take it as a matter of course that a national commonwealth is the last word in political development," Mr. Curtis said in an address to the Johannesburg Rotary Club. "I don't believe it. I believe that the end and object which will be attained in practice is a world commonwealth, that a time will come when there will be a world government."

"Until that time comes there will be no assured peace on this planet, and when it does come there will be assured peace. I want to bring home to you the position we are in today. It is this. The progress of mechanical invention in the last 300 years has turned the family of mankind into one economic society."

"I don't believe you are going to get a world state by a conference convened at one centre framing a constitution. The human mind has got to get out of its fetters and realize that an international commonwealth is possible. When this is realized, I believe the rest will be easy."

King George and Queen Mary do not possess, nor have they sought to possess, the halo of almost legendary romance that surrounded Queen Victoria. Nor does the sovereign's popularity rest on political achievement. But during twenty-five years of hardship and bitter trial the British people have found on their throne a modest, patient, steadfast man whose reliability and stoutness of character proved a pillar of strength through the long tribulation of the war. They have found in those qualities of uprightness and stability the qualities that must be the foundation of the new era. New and severe tests have come to the people of the new age, in which the extraordinarily rapid development of electrical and other devices started by the Victorians, followed by new discoveries and inventions, have brought volatile and changeable qualities to human character. But amid the change and uncertainty, the simple steadfastness of Britain's King and Queen has proved a strength and a comfort not only to the British people, but also to millions of friends in America and other parts of the world, who now unite in offering to their Majesties their felicitations and wishes for a long-continued reign.

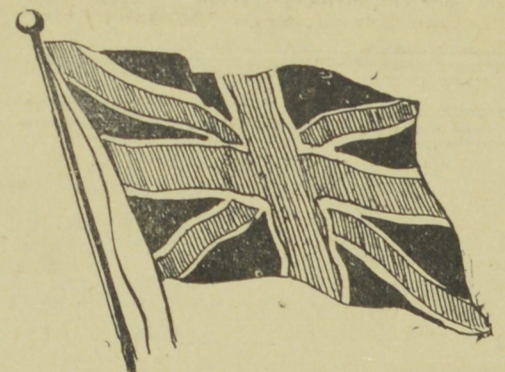
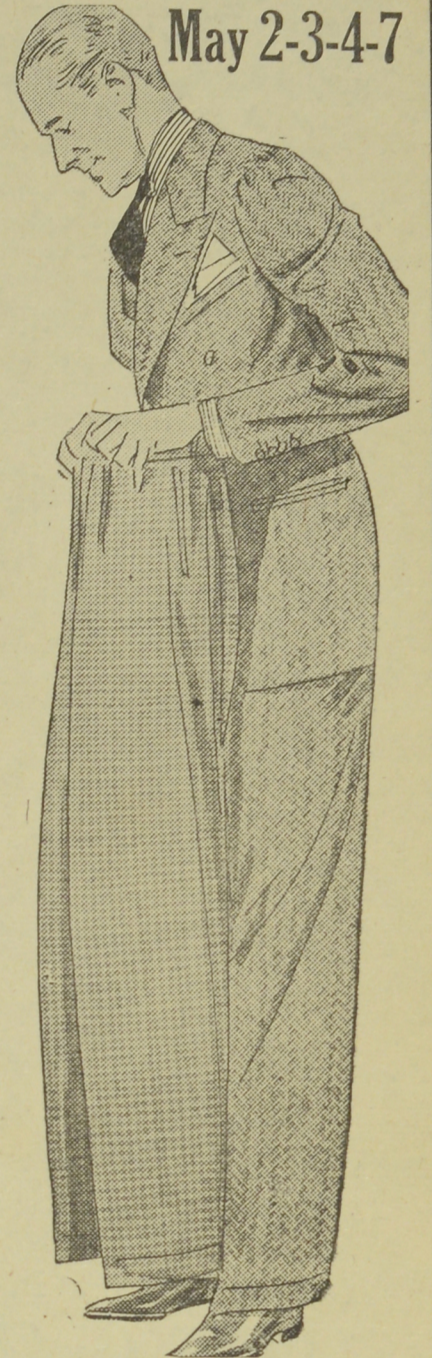
