The New Brunswick Dental Society began its fortieth annual convention here this morning and will continue all day today and tomorrow. About fifty delegates registered this morning when the convention opened. His Worship Mayor W. G. Clark bade official welcome to the delegates in a brief address this morning in the rooms of the city club, where the convention is taking place. At noon luncheon was held at a local hotel.

A feature this morning was the conducting of a clinic with demonstrations by Dr. I. K. Lowry, of Montreal. This afternoon Dr. A. D. A. Mason of the Royal College of Dental Surgery in Toronto; Dr. R. E. McMahon of Montreal and Dr. Lowry will continue the clinic demonstrations. A banquet is scheduled for this evening. Dr. Howard W. MacDonald is president of the N. B. Dental Society. Dr. Walter Irvine, of Boston, is one of those present at the convention.

The annual business session is scheduled for this evening, when a banquet will be held at which Dr. Harry Thompson, field secretary of the Canadian Dental Hygiene Council will be a guest speaker, as will other technicians attending the convention.

More than one hundred physicians from all parts of the province, as well as other places, are expected here for the 55th annual meeting of the New Brunswick Medical Society which opens here tomorrow morning and concludes on Wednesday. The Fredericton Medical Society members and their ladies have arranged for the visit of the members of the provincial society.

Business sessions and the reading of scientific papers are on the two-day agenda and it has also been arranged to entertain the out-of-town physicians, with the Fredericton Medical Society and their ladies as hosts.

The sessions will open tomorrow morning at nine o'clock with registration of delegates. His Worship Mayor W. G. Clark will deliver an address of welcome at ten o'clock. On Tuesday afternoon Dr. R. E. Powell of Montreal, Dr. Cecil E. Kinley, of Halifax, and Dr. E. K. Maclellan of Halifax, will deliver scientific medical papers.

TWO MEMBERS LIQUOR BOARD MAY RESIGN

Report That M. E. Agar And F. J. Robideaux To Quit This Week

No Official Statement

Rumored That M. E. Agar, To Get Senatorship

It is reported today that F. J. Robideaux of Shediac and Miles E. Agar of Saint John who with R. G. Fulton, of this city, constitute the New Brunswick Liquor Control Board, will place their resignation in the hands of the government this week. While this news comes from those who should be in a position to know, R. G. Fulton, chairman of the Board, in response to an enquiry by the Daily Mail today, stated that he had absolutely no knowledge of any such action on the part of his co-workers on the board.

While it is yet too early to discuss the policy of the incoming government in regard to the administration of the Liquor Commission, it is stated, however, that the personnel of the Commission may be reduced so that the one commissioner with his staff of clerks, will handle all executive business.

It is stated in some circles that M. E. Agar, former member of the provincial legislature, who resigned last year to become one of the liquor commissioners, has been promised a senatorship. He and his friends say he has a strong claim for the position.

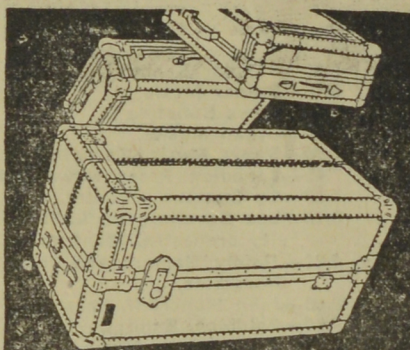
DIVIDED IN PLAY
