APPEAL COURT DELIVERED ONE JUDGMENT TODAY

Conviction Quashed In Case of The King vs. Arthur Lorette

The New Brunswick Appeal Court which met here this morning, delivered one judgment and then adjourned until March 10 at 10.30 o'clock at which time two cases, one the MacGaire will case, will be re-argued.

In the case of The King vs. Arthur Lorette, of this city, the judgment was the quashing of the conviction with costs, Mr. Justice Richards dissenting. Mr. Justice Grimmer and Mr. Justice Richards comprised the court today.

C. R. Hawkins of this city, for the accused, supported an appeal under the New Brunswick Intoxicating Liquor Act from a judgment of the York County Court, Judge A. R. Slipp, by which Arthur Lorette, this city, had been sentenced to a fine of \$200 and costs and a jail term of two months, with an additional two months in default of payment of the fine and costs. Hon. W. H. Harrison, K.C., Attorney-General, had argued contra.

The term of Lorette's sentence had expired and he was convicted on a second charge under The Intoxicating Liquor Act, which sentence he also served. The extent of the second sentence depended on the outcome of the present appeal, for it was to be determined by whether the sentence was for a second offence under the Act, which would require a more severe penalty, or for a first offence.

PROVINCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK MAKES BOND ISSUE

Tender of 102.57 by the
Dominion Securities
Is Accepted

For \$800,000

Loan is the Cheapest the
Province Has Had In
Number of Years

One of the cheapest loans the Province of New Brunswick has had in a great many years was obtained yesterday when a tender of 102.57, made by a syndicate headed by the Dominion Securities Corporation for \$800,000 Province of New Brunswick sinking fund debentures, on a basis of a five-year term at 3½ per cent, was accepted. Announcement was made from the office of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, A. J. Leger. The cost to the province will be 2.94 per cent. Three per cent bonds have been issued in the past but only at a premium. The latest is the first short-term New Brunswick issue.

Tenders were called for the debentures on the basis of a five-year term at 3½ per cent or on a basis of a 15-year term at 4 per cent for the purpose of refunding a 10-year issue.

Four syndicates submitted tenders, three of which quoted offers on both the 15-year basis and the five-year basis, while the fourth offered to buy only 15-year term bonds.

The best bid from the Province's standpoint in the 15-year class came from a syndicate headed by the Bank of Nova Scotia, the offer being 100.20, at a cost to the province of 3.98 per cent, or slightly over a point more than the bid accepted on the five-year term basis.

LEGISLATURE TODAY FINISHED A QUIET WEEK

Little Fireworks in the
House As the Debate
Addresses Wane

Budget Next Week

With no night session scheduled and only two speakers this afternoon, the New Brunswick Legislature will adjourn this afternoon until Tuesday next, when the debate will be wound-up. The present week has been a relatively quiet one in the House with the addresses being more of review and outline of policies rather than contentious.

Dr. W. W. White (Govt., Saint John) will speak for the government side today and he will be followed by W. S. Anderson (Opp., Northumberland). No bills are scheduled for this afternoon. The debate is expected to be wound-up by A. J. Brooks (Govt., Kings), when the House resumes on Tuesday.

The Committee on Standing Rules held a short session this morning, it being the third committee to meet so far during the present session.

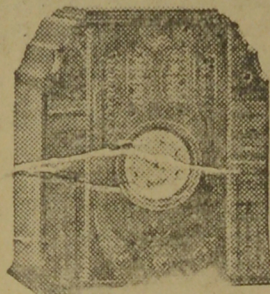
