

SEES NEED FOR ABOLISHING THE DUST NUISANCE

Charles Lanctot, K. C., Deputy Atty-General of Quebec, Visitor

To St. Andrews For Rest

Visiting Quebec Official Comments on Painted Posts, Village Signs.

Charles Lanctot, K. C., deputy-attorney-general of the province of Quebec is a visitor in the capital today, being en route to St. Andrew's-By-The-Sea for several weeks' rest. Mr. Lanctot is accompanied by his sons, Phillipine and Robert.

Speaking with the Daily Mail today Mr. Lanctot commented on New Brunswick's gravel roads. He saw a great need for the clearing up of the dust nuisance on the provincial highways and suggested the treatment of calcium chloride or oil. Painted posts along the highways he considered to be a help to the motorist in night driving. Mr. Lanctot also believes that villages should have clear identifying signs.

The Lanctots admired the beautiful scenery along the Saint John river en route from Quebec.

A. & B. WATER SPORTS HERE THIS AFTERNOON

Everything in Readiness For Annual Regatta On Waters Here

27 Silver Cups

Saint John, Bathurst, Moncton, St. Stephen, B. C. Represented

The stage is all set for the annual regatta and water sports programme of the A. & B. Club which commences this afternoon at two o'clock. Hundreds of visitors are here from various parts of the province, and a throng of citizens are expected to be present this afternoon for the grand summer water sport carnival.

The Saint John Power Boat Club fleet arrived here yesterday and were entertained at a dance last evening at the A. & B. Club and the members invited friends here last evening. Another dance is planned for tonight.

A. & B. Club Entry

A feature this afternoon is the number and diversity of the entries for the various aquatic events. There are about twenty entries from St. John, Bathurst, Moncton and St. Stephen. Also one from far-off British Columbia.

More than 27 silver cups are to be donated to the winners preceding the dance in the clubhouse tonight. Mayor W. G. Clark, Mrs. Clark, Dr. G. C. VanWart and the Countess of Ashburnham will officiate at the presentation.

There will be keen competition in the men's swimming events this year with Vincent Sadovsky, St. John, winner of the high point cup for the past two years, defending his title in the hope of taking permanent possession of the cup. In the ladies single canoe race Gertrude Cremin and Maggie Jean Chestnut each have won the annual cup twice and if either of them wins this year it will remain in her possession permanently.

The evening events will include the men's single sculls, sea-sled races and motorboat races. At 8 p.m. there will be a band concert on the green overlooking the river, following which the contestants will be entertained at a dance.
