These human services cost money and the money comes from the people. "In Ontario the people will be levied for \$15,000,000 in direct taxation," stated Mr. Hanson. "So far New Brunswick has escaped direct taxation," he continued.

In speaking of his position, Mr. Hanson stated that he took it reluctantly, but now that he has taken it, he intends to stick to it until the people say that they do not want him

He said in closing that he was not here to ask for votes for himself but that he was whole heartedly here in support of the Sunbury candidates.
