TIBBETT OFFERS PREMIERE OF OPERETTA HIT

Baritone Also Features Dramatic Aria From Giordano's "Andrea Chenier" and Wagner Lyric.

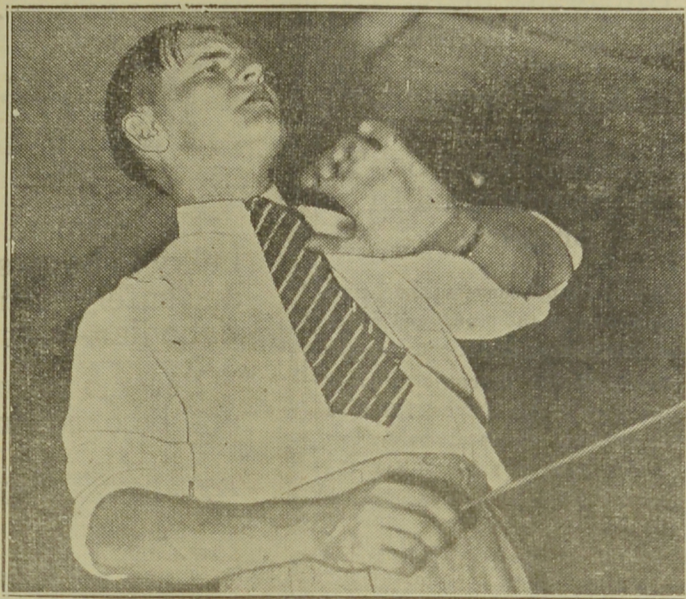
The American premiere of "Because of You", the outstanding hit of the successful English operetta, "Give Me A Ring", will be sung by Lawrence Tibbett during his program with Wilfred Pelletier's orchestra over the coast-to-coast NBC-WJZ network tonight at 9:30 P. M., A. S. T. It was written by Martin Brookes.

Tibbett also has chosen the noted "Nemico della Patria" aria from the highly dramatic opera of the French Revolution, "Andrea Chenier" by Giordano. The selection marks the climax of the third act and occurs as the magistrate consigns Chenier who happens to be his rival in love, to the dungeons of the Bastille for his alleged subversive activities.

Wagner's famous love lyric, "Traume" will be another Tibbett rendition. This particular song, distinguished in its own right, is of great interest to music scholars because it is believed to constitute the sketch from which the composer later developed the magnificent love music for "Tristan and Isolde".

Since going into radio he has sung on many important programs gaining steadily in reputation and popularity. Because of the screen test, Nell did not sing on the January 31st broadcast of the Forum of Liberty, but he will be heard again next Thursday evening.
