## PARASITES AND THEIR EFFECTS ON HUMANS

Dr. S. H. McFarlane of University of Illinois Spoke to Rotarians

### Parasitic Ways Weird

Numerous Diseases Are Caused By These Tiny Parasites

Speaking before the regular weekly Rotary luncheon today at noon, Dr. S. H. McFarlane, of the staff of the Department of Biology at the University of Illinois delivered an instructive and interesting address on parasites. The title of Dr. McFarlane's address was "Are You a Good Host?" and he related the manner in which these parasites enter the human body and set up irritation and disease. "Some of these parasites are weird and wonderful in the methods they use to get to their proper host," said Dr. McFarlane. Dr. McFarlane is at present visiting his father, S. H. McFarlane on York Street.

"Are You a Good Host?" Dr. McFarlane's address to the Rotary club today at noon was in part as follows:

"Emily Post could without a doubt give you all a clean slate as far as social requirements of a host are concerned but taking the word in its biological meaning the question can best be answered by your physician. There are a large number of people in the world to whom Miss Post would give the 'go-bye' in their social aspirations along the line of host and hostess but biologically they are the best hosts.

There is a greater number of animals that have developed the guest complex than most people realize. Every large group, or phylum, of the animal kingdom contains its parasitic representative with one exception which is the group to which the star fish and seaurchins belong. On the other hand there is no group in the animal kingdom that does not have its quota of parasites. Some of these parasites are weird and wonderful in the methods they use to get to their proper host.

"The parasite that started my study of this peculiar group is one that causes an irritation of the skin known as scabies. I believe there are representatives of this parasite (Continued on Page Four)

## FARM CONDITIONS ARE GOOD IN UP RIVER SECTIONS

S. S. Miller, President of Bd. of Trade Says Farmers Encouraged

### Seed Potatoes Scarce

Farmers Went In More For Table Stock This Year; Hay Crop Good

S. S. Miller, president of the Fredericton Board of Trade, has returned from a business trip to the northern part of the province. He reported that agricultural conditions look good at the present time. Potatoes are selling at two dollars per barrel out of the field at Hartland, and three dollars is being offered for Cobble seed potatoes. Seed potatoes are likely to sell at high prices this year, owing to the fact that the farmers in that section of the country

went in more for potato stock and planted less seed potatoes than in former years.

Only on rare occasions is there report of blight or rust, and the crops are progressing favorably. Notwithstanding the backward weather in the early part of the season and some rainy days since that time the farmers are making good progress in hay-making, according to Mr. Miller. The crop promises to be up to the average, despite the fact that some of the

## AUTHORITY ON POTATO USES TO SPEAK HERE

Dr. G. S. Whitby Will Address N. B. Growers' Association

### Field Day Aug. 12

Visitor Investigated Industrial Uses Tuber in Europe

New Brunswick growers will shortly have an opportunity to hear Dr. G. S. Whitby, Chief of the Division of Chemistry, National Branch Council, Ottawa, in an address dealing with the industrial uses of potatoes. The occasion will be a field day sponsored jointly by the New Brunswick Swine Breeders' and Potato Growers' Associations at the Dominion Experimental Station, Fredericton, Aug. 12.

The occasion at the Dominion Experimental Station here will be Dr. Whitby's first since the completion of a recent extensive tour of research. In investigating the industrial uses to which tubers are now being put, the Doctor's travels lead through Holland, Germany and France. In addition he visited glucose and dextrine plants both on the Continent and in the British Isles.

The annual business meetings of both the Swine Breeders' and Potato Growers' Associations will inaugurate the field day on August 12th and arrangements for an interesting programme of lectures and demonstrations have already been completed. Hon. A. C. Taylor, Minister of Agriculture for New Brunswick, will address the combined gathering immediately after lunch.

At the New Brunswick Swine Breeders' and Potato Growers' Field Day, which takes place in the morning, E. W. Brown of Apohaqui, the president, will deliver his president's address. Other addresses will be given by A. W. Peterson, of the

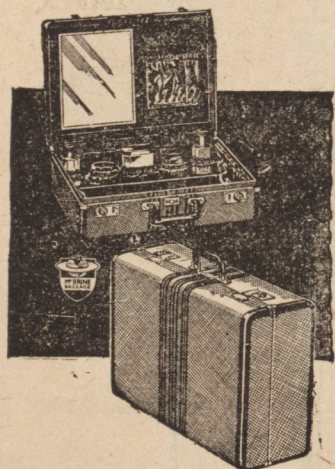
