The Pacific Coast League, having sent up its pride and joy, Joe DiMaggio, to the majors, and having seen him carry on so successfully, wants to know whether it deserves the top-ranking place among all minor leagues. The answer, judging by the number of rookies who have been graduated from its loop and rival circuits this season, should be no, emphatically no.

Besides DiMaggio, none of its graduates has distinguished himself to any extent. Three others have escaped the axe. Gene Lillard, who was the leading home run hitter on the Coast last season, is a utility infielder for the Cubs, and has a batting average of .160 in nine games. In one of these games, a pinch-hitter was sent up to bat for him, and a Coast writer thought it was funny, or else Coast players were being underrated by the big leagues.

A second Coast Leaguer, Joe Becker, has made the grade as third-string catcher for the Indians, and a third, Jim Oglesby, who was injured at the start of the season, is a member of the Athletics.

When this sparse production is compared with the twelve former players of the American Association, class of 1935, and the ten up from the International League, there doesn't seem to be any room for argument. Perhaps none is a Joe DiMaggio, but they have made the jump to big time and most of them are regulars.
