Hallowe'en Peanut Butter Cookies

1/2 cup butter 1/2 cup peanut butter

1/2 cup granulated sugar ½ cup brown sugar

1 egg, well beaten

11/4 cups flour 34 teaspoon soda

1/2 teasppoon baking powder 1/4 teaspoon salt. Cream butter and peanut butter to-

gether. Add sugar gradually and Fold in carefully: 4 egg whites, cream thoroughly. Add well beaten egg to creamed mixture. Sift flour once before measuring. Sift flour, moderate oven (300 degrees F.) for soda, baking powder and salt together and add to creamed mixture. Chill dough well, then form into balls the size of a walnut. Place balls on lightly greased baking sheet. Flatten with fork dipped in flour, making crisscross pattern. Bake in a moderate oven, 375 degrees F., from 10 to 12 Cream together, using more juice or minutes. Makes four dozen cookies.
