Children and Danger

WITHIN the last week or two four fatal accidents took place within a few miles of Fredericton, caused by children sliding down hill and running into cars and trucks. Two of these accidents were near Newcastle, one near Hartland. In all cases the accidents were unavoidable so far as the trucks were concerned. The children were sliding downhill as the truck came out of a cross road, or the child was coming around a blind turn in the

Parents at this holiday season cannot be too particular about warning their children to avoid dangers in sliding downhill. All children like to slide and while the sledding is probably none too good today, still there may be good sliding before the holidays are over. Two or three of our hillsides are crossed by railway tracks. At York and Regent Streets there are entrances to freight sheds and ware houses. All these places are frequented by trucks and by lighter cars. The drivers are not on the lookout for children gliding down the road on a sled. The danger is especially great when the roads are covered with ice. Then there is the railway track which is also a source of danger.

It would not be a bad idea to provide a nice sliding place for the children somewhere along the river bank and out onto the river. This could be easily handled. The children should have a sliding place and an open air rink. We have the ground, we have the water to flood the rink and we have lots of men who could do the job of keeping the rink cleared and flooded. The Arctic rink never was suitable for the children to skate in and it is not suitable now. They do not get a fair show in regard to hours,

If you want to keep the children out of danger and wish to give them pleasure, provide suitable places in which they may play.

SAN SALVADOR, Dec. 21-A disastrous earthquake which destroyed the town of San Vicente and neighboring villages in Central America, has caused loss of over two hundred lives and much damage.

San Vicente, eyewitnesses of the uins stated, was virtually destroyed. Families of the survivors were declared to be fleeing to neighboring towns as the temblors continued.

Visitors to the scene of the catas trophe said villages near San Vicente, which is 40 miles south of San Salvador, also had suffered greatly from the quake.

Government officials returning from the provincial capital said an accurate estimate of the total dead and injured could not be made immediately because of the extent of the ruins which impeded the rescue parties.
