dinner a choice selection of tasty fish

**WOMEN ARE NEARLY IMMUNE**  
**TO COLOUR-BLINDNESS**

**Not One Discovered in Tests at Toronto---Effect**  
**of Colour on Disposition Revealed**

On strict scientific authority, the  
masculine viewpoint on matters of  
colour harmonies, colour schemes and  
colour, is not apt to be as expert as  
the feminine. In the striking Pavilion  
of Industrial Chemistry at the recent  
Canadian National Exhibition here,  
more than 12,000 persons checked  
their tendencies to colour blindness  
by the Ichihara colour sensitivity  
tests demonstrated in connection  
with a special show of paint and en-  
amel finishes including the new syn-  
thetic resin finishes. Not one colour  
blind woman was discovered while  
numerous cases of colour blindness  
among men were revealed.

Not to find a single colour-blind  
woman was, the experts in attend-  
ance admitted, unusual. The number  
of colour-blind men averages nearly  
five in one hundred; women only four  
in a thousand.

In an adjoining display in the same  
Pavilion, it was revealed that colours  
influence the disposition, temperam-  
ent and general health. Colour com-  
binations for the bedroom and boudoir  
were demonstrated in detail.

Where the walls are carried out in  
rose with silver trim, blue rugs and  
blue net curtains complete the colour  
ensemble. Yellow and silver trim,  
the display shows, takes green cur-  
tains and green rug; grey walls with  
a green trim have amber curtains and  
a black rug; blue with deep blue trim  
takes amber curtains and a rosewood  
rug. Types of modernistic boudoir  
furniture to accompany these colour  
schemes were also shown as well as  
concealed lighting arrangements.  
Even the toiletries sets used by the  
modern lady are of soft pastel  
shades of Oriental blue, champagne,  
chartreuse and rose.

**PEPPER RELISH PEPS UP THE MEAL**

**Both Decorative and Tasty is This Favourite**  
**Condiment**

One of the most popular relishes  
that can be served with any meat  
course is pepper relish. It is truly a  
"side-kick" for the main course of any  
luncheon, dinner or supper, for it has  
such delicious flavour and looks very  
gay on the table with its red and  
green sweet peppers.

The markets now offer fine red and  
green sweet peppers, shiny and full-  
some, just asking to have their color  
and flavour preserved for future use,  
and pepper relish is the answer.

This relish gives new character to  
salad dressings, too—just stir some  
into boiled salad dressing or mayon-  
naise and you have a new and exotic  
salad dressing. It is also very tasty  
mixed with cream cheese for sand-  
wiches, and is good by itself for an  
evening snack with buttered toast.

Many prizes are going to be won  
at Fall Fairs this year with jars of  
this smart pepper relish. Here is the  
recipe that does the trick:

**Pepper Relish**  
2 cups (14 oz.) prepared peppers  
6½ cups (2½ lbs.) sugar  
1½ cups cider vinegar  
1 bottle fruit pectin.

To prepare peppers, cut open about  
one dozen medium peppers and dis-  
card seeds. For best color, use equal  
amounts green and red sweet pep-  
pers. Put through food chopper  
twice, using finest knife. Drain pulp  
in sieve. Measure sugar and vinegar  
into large kettle. Add prepared pep-  
per, packing it solidly into cup until  
juice comes to top. Mix well and  
bring to a full rolling boil over hot-  
test fire. Stir constantly before and  
while boiling. Boil hard two min-  
utes. Remove from fire and stir in  
bottled fruit pectin. Then stir and  
skim by turns for just five minutes to  
cook slightly, to prevent floating  
fruit. Pour quickly. Paraffin and  
cover at once. Makes about nine  
glasses (6 fluid ounces each). Sets  
slowly, sometimes requiring two  
weeks.

morning toast? In Canada we are  
lucky in having such delicious vari-  
eties of jams and jellies for this im-  
portant part of the breakfast menu,  
and Tomato Relish makes yet another  
welcome change in the round of  
goodies. It has such a different and  
delicious flavour.

It certainly is easily made and in-  
expensive. Canadian housewives are  
lucky in being able to make this relish  
with so little time and effort by the  
short-boil method.

**Tomato Relish**

3 cups (1½ lbs.) prepared tomato  
6½ cups (2½ lbs.) sugar.  
1 bottle fruit pectin.  
To prepare tomatoes, scald, peel,  
and crush about 2½ pounds ripe to-  
matoes, or use canned tomatoes. Boil 4  
cups crushed tomatoes ten minutes,  
uncovered, stirring constantly. Add  
¼ cup lemon juice and grated rind of  
one lemon. (For use with meats, add  
½ teaspoon each ground cloves, all-  
spice, and cinnamon, or Worcester-  
shire sauce to taste). Measure sugar  
into large kettle. Add prepared to-  
mato, filling up last cup with water if  
necessary. Mix well and bring to a  
full rolling boil over hottest fire. Stir  
constantly before and while boiling.  
Boil hard two minutes. Remove ket-  
tle from fire and stir in fruit pectin.  
Skim; pour quickly. Paraffin and  
cover at once. Makes about 9 glasses  
(6 fluid ounces each).

**MALTA HAS**  
**MANY TOURISTS**

There is one country, at any rate,  
where exports do not seem to worry  
the governing authorities. It is Mal-  
ta, in the Mediterranean, where the  
tourist traffic is counted on to bal-  
ance trade, in addition to salaries to  
British officers and soldiers. Malta,  
nevertheless, had an increase in trade  
of 8.8 per cent last year over the  
previous year, imports increasing 8.6  
per cent and exports 12.6 per cent.  
Canada and Australia were the coun-  
tries which showed the greatest per-  
centage of increase in value of im-  
ports, the increase in the case of  
Canada amounting to 91 per cent and  
Australia 96 per cent, according to  
the Industrial Department of the Cana-  
dian National Railways. Canada  
ranks ninth in the list of countries  
supplying goods to this market. Great  
Britain is the chief source of supply,  
followed by Italy, Roumania, Ger-  
many, Australia, Turkey, Holland,  
France, Canada, Japan, Belgium, the  
United States, Dutch East Indies.  
Turkey has a decrease of 40 per  
cent, the United States 31 per cent,  
Italy 25 per cent, Japan 17 per cent,  
Roumania 8.7 per cent. Other coun-  
tries showed increases. The bulk of  
Canada's trade is in wheat and wheat  
flour.
