MAKE SUMMER SWEETS WITH MODERN PRODUCTS

Velvety Smooth Ice Cream Easily Made Without Even a Freezer

Ice cream that has those little hard crystals of ice in it is always such a disappointment, and yet that so often happens when ice cream is made at home in a mechanical refrigerator on account of the still freezing.

Of course if pure cream is used for the ice cream, it is always smooth but who can take anything so rich as an all-cream ice in these days of slimming diets or sluggish livers? Some milk must be used and here is a recipe that will give you a velvety smooth ice cream which can be made in either a mechanical refrigerator or an ordinary ice cream freezer which you won't need to give even a turn!

Equal parts of salt and ice may be used in the freezer or outside container and when the cream mixture is put in, let it stand three to four hours.

In using this recipe, unsweetened minute tapioca that cooks in 5 minutes is the one required.

3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca.
2 cups milk.
1-3 cup sugar.
1-4 teaspoon salt.
1 tablespoon vanilla.
3 tablespoons light corn syrup.
2 egg whites.
1 cup cream, whipped.
2 tablespoons sugar.

Add tapioca to milk in top or double boiler. Place over rapidly boiling water, bring to scalding point (allow 3 to 5 minutes), and cook 5 minutes, stirring frequently. Strain hot mixture, stirring (not rubbing) but gently stirring) through very fine sieve, onto 1-3 cup sugar, salt and corn syrup. Stir until sugar is dissolved. Chill. Add 2 tablespoons sugar to egg whites and beat until stiff; fold into cold tapioca mixture. Fold in cream and vanilla. Turn into freezing tray of automatic refrigerator and freeze as rapidly as possible.

—3 to 4 hours is usually required. Or turn mixture into container, cover tightly and pack in equal parts salt and ice 2 to 3 hours. Makes 1 quart of ice cream.

A perfect accompaniment for this ice cream is a light Coconut Layer Cake.

Coconut Layer Cake

2 cups sifted cake flour.
2 teaspoons baking powder.
1-2 teaspoon salt.
2-3 cup butter or other shortening.
1 cup sugar.
3 eggs well beaten.
1-3 cup milk.
1 teaspoon vanilla.
3 egg whites, stiffly beaten.
Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift together three times. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating thoroughly after each. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount until smooth. Add vanilla and fold in egg whites. Bake in 2 greased 9-inch layer pans in moderate oven (375 degrees Fahrenheit) 25 to 30 minutes. Double recipe to make three 10-inch layers. Spread with Seven Minute Frosting.

2 egg whites, unbeaten.
1-2 cups sugar.
1-2 teaspoons light corn syrup.
5 tablespoons water.
1 teaspoon vanilla.

Put egg whites, sugar, water, and corn syrup in upper part of double boiler. Beat with rotary egg beater until thoroughly mixed. Place over rapidly boiling water, beat constantly with rotary egg beater, and cook 7 minutes, or until frosting will stand in peaks. Remove from boiling water; add vanilla, and beat until thick enough to spread. Spread on cake and sprinkle with 1-2 cups coconut, premium shred style, toasted. Makes enough frosting to cover tops and sides of two 9-inch layers.
