D. J. MACLEOD TO TAKE UP ADVANCED WORK, CAMBRIDGE

Will Investigate Virus Diseases of Potatoes in Eastern Canada

L. J. Howatt in Charge

Mr. MacLeod Has Been Connected With Many Activities Here

D. J. MacLeod, officer-in-charge of the Dominion Field Laboratory of Plant Pathology of this city, has been recommended by the Dominion Botanist and Director of Experimental Farms for a year of advanced study on virus diseases of potatoes at Cambridge University, England, where special facilities are afforded for this type of investigation. This is in accordance with the Dominion Government policy of sending workers to British and foreign institutions with a view to developing specialists to direct important phases of research in the Dominion.

Mr. MacLeod has been investigating virus diseases of potatoes since 1924, and has mobilized at Fredericton the most comprehensive collection of potato virus material in Canada, much of which will be taken to Cambridge for critical study. Mr. MacLeod's special problem will be an investigation of the nature and constitution of virus diseases affecting potatoes especially in Eastern Canada. At Cambridge Mr. MacLeod will be under the immediate direction of two eminent authorities on virus diseases—Dr. R. N. Salaman and Dr. Kenneth Smith. The investigation of virus diseases of potatoes is an important phase of the extensive cooperative project now under way at the Dominion Experimental Station and Plant Pathological Laboratory, the purpose of which is to develop varieties of potatoes resistant to important diseases serving as limiting factors in the production of this crop. Owing to the importance of New Brunswick as a potato growing province, this work has been centred at the Fredericton Station.

Mr. MacLeod has been officer-in-charge of the Fredericton laboratory since 1924 during which time he has conducted special researches on potato diseases and is the author of a number of publications on this subject.

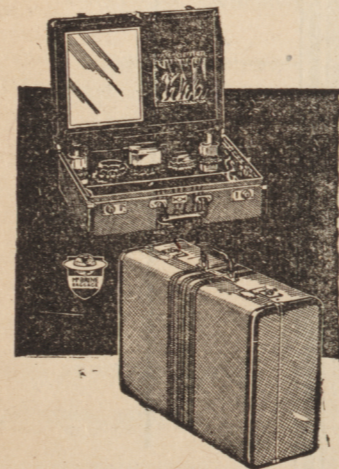
