NEW LICENSE PLATES

This year's motor vehicle license plates consist of black letters and figures on a white background with a feature being that the plates have slots at the bottom as well as at the top this year. This makes it easier to attach them to license plate holders on automobiles. The plates are stamped the same as in other years. the same letters being used to identify the various districts of the province. Another feature is that the places are being issued only from the local office of the Motor Vehicle branch of the department of public works. The new plates have "New Brunswick-36" at the bottom, whereas last year this appeared at the top. Last year there were aluminum letters and figures on a black background.
