Egyptian Government And Great Britain Come to Agreement

(Special to The Daily Mail)
LONDON, Nov. 13—The Royal Com-
mission which has been appointed to
look into affairs in Palestine, held its
first meeting today. The Egyptian
Chamber of Deputies have come to an
agreement on a treaty with Great
Britain after considerable discussion.
The main hold-up in bringing about
the agreement in the treaty was in
connection with certain military
cases. In announcing the agreement
the chairman said that the Egyptian
government gave out comparatively
little in exchange for the protection
which they would receive from Great
Britain. He stated that the alliance
with Great Britain would mean far
greater security for their country.

Germany Protests Arrests Citizens in Moscow

protest for the arrest of several Ger-
man citizens in Moscow. These Ger-
mans were arrested on a charge of
trying to set up Fascist organizations
in Russia.

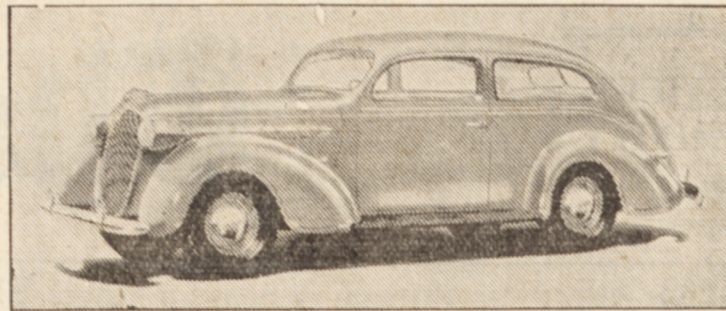
