And in 1935 the number of accidents reported was 105 more than in the previous year.

Careless driving is also blamed directly for 16 of the deaths caused in 1935 whilst then resulted through pedestrians stepping in the paths of motor vehicles and eight children playing on the roads were killed. A total of 287 passengers were injured. Of the 558 reported accidents 487
