Amateur Boxing Tonight

Between 25 and 30 Bouts Scheduled for Card at Opera House Tonight

The New Brunswick amateur boxing championships will be held here tonight.

Twenty bouts are lined up for three classes and in other divisions there will probably be enough scrappers here for between 25 and 30 bouts.

The championship scraps will be staged at the Opera House and Frank O'Leary of Saint John will be the third man in the ring.

Eight will compete for honors in the welterweight or 147-pound class, seven in the middleweight division

and five in the lightweight or 135-pound class.

It is expected that other classes 112, 118, 126 and 175 will have several entrants. Each bout on the card is scheduled to go five, two-minute rounds.

W. W. Lasky is promoting the meet for the Devon Baseball Club, under whose auspices the championship will be held.

Entries will be from Campbellton, Woodstock, Saint John, Minto, McAdam and St. Stephen, as well as this city.

FRED PERRY IS ROUNDING INTO TENNIS FORM

World's First Ranking Player Comments on His 1936 Chances

CANNES, France, April 27 — Fred Perry, the world's ranking tennis player, is on the comeback trail, deliberately rounding into form on the courts along the French Riviera.

The smiling British ace says the back injury he suffered in a fall while playing Wilmer Allison in the semi-finals of the United States championships at Forest Hills, L.I., last September is healed completely.

On that occasion Allison beat Perry, then defending champion, in straight sets, but many claimed the Texan won a hollow victory at best because the Englishman sprained his back in the third set.

"I feel no pain now, and my muscles are hardening," says Perry. "If I round into perfect condition again, I am going to help England keep the Davis cup at home."

Physicians who examined the British champion say the six-week period of training with the Arsenal soccer team is largely responsible for his return to form.

Perry believes it's too soon to express a definite opinion of his condition, but tennis forecasts predict he'll rank No. 1 again this year. "Temperamental Fred" breezed through two minor tournaments on the Riviera with ease, pulling off sharp angle shots and volleying faultlessly.

His appearance on the Cannes court marked the end of a six months' desertion of the courts, during which time he was encased in bandages. "I didn't touch a racket in all that time," he declared. "The first layer of bandages came off only a few weeks ago."

Perry expresses the opinion the United States would regain the Davis cup with ease if Ellsworth Vines were on the American team. "Vines is un-
