### INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL SYSTEM INTRODUCED

Expect Great Saving in  
Time and Money

Ontario's long-considered intermediate schools set-up took definite form this week when Hon. Dr. L. J. Simpson, minister of education, introduced special legislation to inaugurate a new four-year course of study to replace the public schools junior and senior fourth classes, and the first two forms of collegiate and high schools.

The first of these "intermediate" institutions will, it is anticipated, be opened early in September.

Nine definite improvements are expected from the new policy. Pupils will be afforded the opportunity to begin what are looked upon as high school subjects earlier in their school life than is possible under the present system, and for the gifted students it will mean the saving of an entire year.

In these new schools there will be a segregation of adolescents, with the advantages which psychologists see in such conditions. Construction of separate buildings is not necessarily involved. Teachers will have a chance to discover the aptitudes of their pupils so that they may better guide them into one of the three classes of secondary schools.

Large numbers of pupils who stop their schooling when the age of compulsory attendance has been passed, will be able now to leave schools with a certificate of graduation. High schools will, as a result of the new policy, have a more select group of students and should be able to give more advanced courses. Cost of education will be

### ORGANIZER HERE SUMMER VISIT

MONTREAL, Quebec, April 28 — Miss E. M. Zimmern, of London, corresponding secretary of the Associated Countrywomen of the World, arrived from England in the Canadian Pacific liner Montclare yesterday morning.

Her visit is in connection with the annual meeting of the International Organization to be held at Washington in June from which the delegates will return by way of Montreal.

"I am to meet Miss Hazel McCain, of MacDonald College, to discuss arrangements for the entertainment of the delegates after the convention," Miss Zimmern told ship news reporters who met the Montclare.

The Associated countrywomen of the World is a federation of Women's Institutes of which a former Toronto woman, Mrs. Alfred Watt, of London, England, is the president. Mrs. Watt started the Women's Institute movement in England when she took up residence there in 1917.

Miss Zimmern will stay in Montreal two or three days before going to Washington.

lowered by ensuring less wastage. Pupils will have closer contact with their teachers. Services of all-round teachers, rather than specialists, will be enlisted. The schools will enable a rural pupil of 14 or 15 years of age to attend a school within daily reach of his home.

Establishment of the new type of schools will, according to Dr. Duncan McArthur, deputy minister of education, probably be effected first in centres where high schools are filled to capacity and accommodation for additional pupils can be more economically provided by building an addition to the public school, rather than an addition to the high school. Thus both the capital expenditure involved and the cost of maintenance will be less than in the high school.

In order to encourage the establishment of such schools, a new scheme of legislative grants will be adopted whereby the cost of equipment, the per centage paid on teachers' salaries, the grants on certificates, will be greater than in either the public or high school. It is expected that the local cost will be further lessened by the possibility afforded by the intermediate school to lessen by one year the speed at which the more gifted pupils can pass through the whole system. This will be brought about, it is said, by the chance this type of school gives pupils to commence foreign languages, algebra and elementary science at an earlier age than is now possible.

### AID TO FISHING INDUSTRY IN GLOUCESTER CO.

A tentative plan whereby the deep-sea fishing industry of Gloucester county will be built up again was announced at meeting of fishermen in Caraquet last night, and a committee composed of W. E. McMullen, of this city, chairman; L. G. Landry of Grand Anse; Councillor Joseph G. Chiasson, of Caraquet outlined the procedure to be followed.

F. T. B. Young, M. P. P., of Caraquet, also was present. The fishing industry has been hit pretty hard recently and fishermen were unable to get credit from the merchants to prepare their boats and outfit themselves for work.

Each owner or captain or crew member taking advantage of this plan will be required to sign a promissory note payable to the provincial secretary-treasurer, for the amount of the order he receives. These notes will be payable November 1. When paid, it is planned to apply the amounts toward the establishing of a special fund earmarked "Gloucester County deep sea fisheries fund", which is to be made available at any future time to those engaged in this industry, to enable them to repair and equip their vessels and themselves to continue their work. It was stated—should they need a "loan" to do this.

"The fundamental idea", it was stated, is to assist the men to rehabilitate the industry, and at the same time impress on the people the necessity of paying back to the government the money advanced, so a fund will be
