Thus both the capital expenditure involved and the cost of maintenance will be less than in the high school.

> In order to encourage the establishment of such schools, a new scheme of legislative grants will be adopted whereby the cost of equipment, the per centage paid on teachers' salaries, the grants on cerificates, will be greater than in either the public or high school. It is expected that the local cost will be further lessened by the possibility afforded by the intermediate school to lessen by one year the speed at which the more gifted pupils can pass through the whole system. This will be brought about, it is said, by the chance this type of school gives pupils to commence foreign languages, algebra and elementary science at an earlier age than is now
