"The Act requiring children to support their parents so far as reasonupon the determination of the amount of the pension. There is considerable misunderstanding about this matter due largely to the lack of study of the regulations made by the Government of Canada in 1932.

Under those regulations our Board is absolutely required, in fixing the amount of the pension, to take into account, amongst other things, all of the sources of income which the pen sioner may reasonably be expected to eceive, whether in wages or other means of livelihood, in money or in kind, and this includes a reasonable expectation of receiving his lodging and his board from those chidren or other persons who would naturally supply the same and we are also required to take into consideration even gratuities which the pensioner may reasonably be expected to receive. You will notice that this is a provision of the Dominion and is imperative.

"If the Parents Maintenance Ac? had never been passed we would still be governed by the above mentioned regulations and in fixing the amount of the pension we naturally would have to assume that children will support their parents, generally by law to do so.
