YORK COUNTY ABATTOIR TO BE STARTED JUNE 1

Hope That Guarantee From Gov't Will Mean Cold Storage Also

Industrial Buildup

Expert on Abattoirs to Be Here From Boston, Mass.

The much discussed abattoir for York County will be begun on June 1st it was learned here today by The Daily Mail. Peter Nugard, promoter of the plan, stated today the matter of the cold storage plant in conjunction with the abattoir depends on the management board receiving the guarantee which has been promised by the government.

Mr. Nugard said today, that if no guarantee comes with a week or two that the abattoir will be proceeded with and the cold storage proposition will be abandoned for this year.

Since the plan was first brought up The Daily Mail has advocated the erection of an abattoir for the sake of the industrial development of this community and has reported from time to time on the progress made to have it built.

Ald. F. S. Mundle, chairman of the abattoir committee of the city council, announced today that while no site has been definitely decided upon yet the most likely site to be chosen is on the Woodstock road.

With ten days Daniel Worcester of Boston, Mass., an equipment man, and an expert on abattoirs, will be here to investigate the site of the new abattoir and plan for its erection it was stated by Ald. Mundle. The Boston expert will examine every angle preparatory to the erection of the abattoir.

New Uniforms For City Police

The city police donned new uniforms today, the first issue of new uniforms for about a quarter of a century. The new uniforms are single-breasted, open at the neck, have peaked lapels, and show blue shirts and black four-in-hand ties beneath the tunic. PRECAUTIONS AGAINST 1936 INSECT PROBLEM

R. E. Balch of the Entomological Dept. Discusses Matter

An Annual Nuisance

Hills, Front Lawns and Gardens in Danger of Infestation

Early precautionary steps against the insect nuisance which not only destroys vegetation but proves a great inconvenience to householders, and citizens in general, are already contemplated by the local entomological department of the Dominion of Canada, of which R. E. Balch is in charge.

Mr. Balch stated today that it was a bit too early to give out information as to the insect pest situation for the approaching season. Cutworms which infest the gardens and lawns, ants, and mosquitoes, are the principal offenders. But as the latter two do not make their appearance until the warmer weather, and as it is difficult to plan a campaign against them until they are actually observed, nothing tangible can be done at the present time.

The main duties of both Mr. Balch and Mr. Gorham are to warn the citizens of these annual pests and to take general steps to have them eradicated. It is up to the citizens themselves to listen to their words of advice respecting the elimination of this nuisance.

Mr. Balch observed today, however, that precautions will be taken to have the insect pests eradicated.

Hills, front lawns, and the rear portions of the city are the chief spots of concentration of the insect pests. Last year Mr. Balch did considerable work to eradicate this evil and he plans a more comprehensive campaign for the coming summer.

From early May until the middle of August, ornamental plants in gardens are subject to attack by insects. R. P. Graham, Dominion Laboratory here, told the Fredericton Horticultural Society recently. Beginning with cutworms in the first really warm evenings in May, there is a more or less regular succession of plant pests which take their toll of the plants grown by gardeners, both amateur and professional. Only a few of these insects completely destroy the plants but there are a number which cause enough injury to worry the plant and flower lover and dampen the ardour and mar the joy of gardening. Therefore the pressing need of every garden is frequent visits of the gardener (Continued on Page Five)

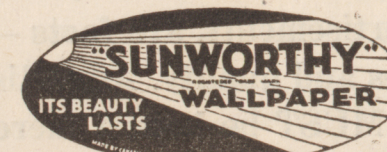
