pert supervision of Mr. Frank E. McNulty, in all branches of Fountain technique and special customer service.

George Steele, for the past three years manager of Ross-Drug-United (Downtown) Store will be manager of the new store. Mr. Steele has been closely connected with the drug business for many years in various capacities. He is a graduate druggist of the Province of New Brunswick. His many friends will congratulate him upon the promotion.

An attractive feature of the steel shelving system along one entire wall of the store in which regular lines of toilet articles are displayed. Below the

shelving are small glass-partitioned compartments in which all patent medicines and proprietary drug preparations in common demand are handily placed.

The new Open Dispensary is finished in all white enamel. It is of Long Steel Sanitary construction. Marble mixing tables are used as mixing tables for the preparation of salves and ointments. There is an efficient still for the distillation of pure water. The shelving within the dispensary and the separate drug compartments are all metal steel construction.

Torsion scales are essential to the accurate compounding of prescriptions of so fine an accuracy that they can weigh the weight of a pencil mark, safeguard the patient and insure meticulous exactitude in weighing all prescription ingredients.

The front of the dispensary carries steel shelving on which special prominence will be given to such high class lines as Elizabeth Arden, Jane Seymour, and DuBarry Beauty Preparations.

A cordial invitation is extended to all to view the store on Opening Day, Thursday, Sept. 17th.

Dr. P. G. Thompson, who is now occupying one of the new suites of offices in the Ryan Building, is a son of G. R. Thompson of this city. He was born at North Devon in 1903 where he attended Devon Superior School until 1920, when his family moved to Fredericton. In Fredericton he attended St. Dunstan's School and entered High School in 1923. He played for F.H.S. on the 1925 hockey team and captained the team in 1926 up to the N. B. finals. He was also a member of the 1926 football team.

In 1927 he entered U.N.B. and played with the collegiate senior ball team although a junior at the time. He entered the University of Pittsburgh in Pittsburgh, U.S.A. in 1927 to study Dental Surgery. While in Pittsburgh he played with the Duquesne Garden Hornets in Western Pennsylvania Hockey Leagues. He also played with the champion inter-fraternity softball team.

In 1932 he graduated with the degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery.

Dr. Thompson was a member of the Fredericton Capital hockey team of 1932. He managed and played for the Tartar Baseball Team and also organized the modern Fredericton Pets baseball team up to 1936. In 1936 he has played as a member of the Devon ball team.

He is a member of the Knights of Columbus.
