EDDIE SHORE COMPLAINS HE LOST \$2,000 IN PLAYOFFS

Bad Refereeing Beat Him Out of That Amount, Bruin Stalwart Claims

EDMONTON, May 20—Eddie Shore wants to buy Boston Bruins—the team he leads in National Hockey League warfare — and he is determined to keep trying to purchase the club; he thinks he has eight more years of major league hockey in his well-stitched frame, and he is sure in no uncertain manner he can succeed as a player-manager.

In an interview while passing through Edmonton Saturday on his way to the farm he owns and operates at Duagh, Alta., Bruins' colorful captain and rearguard, talked of hockey and his "madman" performance against Toronto Maple Leafs in the Stanley Cup playdowns.

Shore said he had made an effort to buy the Boston club this spring for "around \$300,000" but the deal which would have made him the first playing-owner in the N. H. L., fell through.

"You'll try and buy it next year?" he was asked.

"And the next too, if I get the chance," Shore replied.

About that game in Toronto when

Leafs overcame a 4-0 lead and knocked Boston out of the play-offs after Shore had been given a 10-minute misconduct penalty for shooting the puck at Referee Odie Cleghorn, the defenceman had something to say.

"Some of the reports were not so good," he declared. "Pictures that appeared in the papers that night after the game showed Red Horner in the crease high-kicking our goalie, Tiny Thompson. Sure the puck was in the net, but it was kicked in.

"I skated up to Cleghorn and protested about his calling it a goal. But he refused to listen to me and finally, although I was merely telling him what I thought, he gave me a penalty — 10 minutes misconduct.

"I was certainly 'hot' then. I told him plenty. The past four years he has been instrumental in ruining our playoff chances."

"Did you shoot the puck at him?"

"I honestly don't know," Shore answered. "When you are playing your hardest and fighting an uphill battle and then suddenly get an unfair deal, you do things on the spur of the moment, and maybe the reports are true that I shot the puck at Cleghorn. I don't know.

"I'll always believe that if we had a fair shake in the refereeing we could have beaten Toronto easily. Then against Detroit, I am pretty sure we could have won although, in my opinion, that series would have been the toughest of the two."

"When you get bumped out of a playoff series you lose money," Shore said. "I figure I have lost close to \$2,000 in the last four years because of some raw arbitrating."

24-Year-Old Sensation Continues March Towards English Ladies' Golf Title.

SOUTHPORT, Eng., May 19—Miss Bridget Newell, young justice of the peace from Derbyshire, emerged victorious from a pair of hot fights today to become favorite for the British women's golf championship as the challenging United States contingent was cut to a single player.

The 24-year-old Miss Newell, who captured the qualifying medal and upset defending champion Morgan in the first round, added another pair of well-known homesters to her list of the vanquished in the second and third rounds.

In the morning the long-stroking Bridget turned back Diana Fishwick, 1930 titleholder, two up, then went on to win three and two in the afternoon over Mrs. H. V. Newton.

At the end of a wild windy day which saw the American menace scattered all over Southport's sandhills, only Marion Milley, tall daughter of a Kentucky professional, remained to combat seven Englishwomen for a trophy which has never crossed the ocean.

Four United States Curtis Cup players fell before British opponents. Patty Berg, Minneapolis, and Mrs. Leona Cheney, Los Angeles, were put out in the morning. Mrs. Maureen Orcutt Crews, Coal Gables and Charlotte Glutting, South Orange N. J., were eliminated in the third round.

Nedda, 1:58 3/4, the fastest of all trotting mares, has by her side at Walnut Farm a bay colt by Guy Aubrey, 2:06 3/4, the sire of Greyhound and Calumet Evelyn. The twenty-one-year old daughter of Atlantic Express, 2:07 3/4, is fulfilling in the harem all the promise of her breeding and performances, only one of her five foals that are old enough to train having failed to trot in 2:10 when three years old or better. This was last season's three-year-old, Transformer, 2:16 3/4. The fastest are Meda, 2:03 3/4, winner of the \$14,000 Kentucky Futurity, and Nedda Guy, 2:03 3/4, winner of the \$12,000 Championship Stallion Futurity. A full sister of Meda is among the ninety-odd yearlings now being schooled for the annual sale in New York next November.

Richard the Third, a chestnut colt for which E. J. Baker paid \$3,800 at the November sale of yearlings last fall, recently trotted a mile in 2:12 in his work at Lexington. This is the fastest mile reported this spring for any two-year-old outside of Florida. The speedy youngster is a son of Mr. McElwain, 1:59 1/4, and Princess Elowah, 2:03 3/4, by Etowah, 2:03. Athlone's Santos Boy, two-year-old developed by W. F. Caton, worked in 2:20 at Lexington, with the last half in 1:05 1/2.

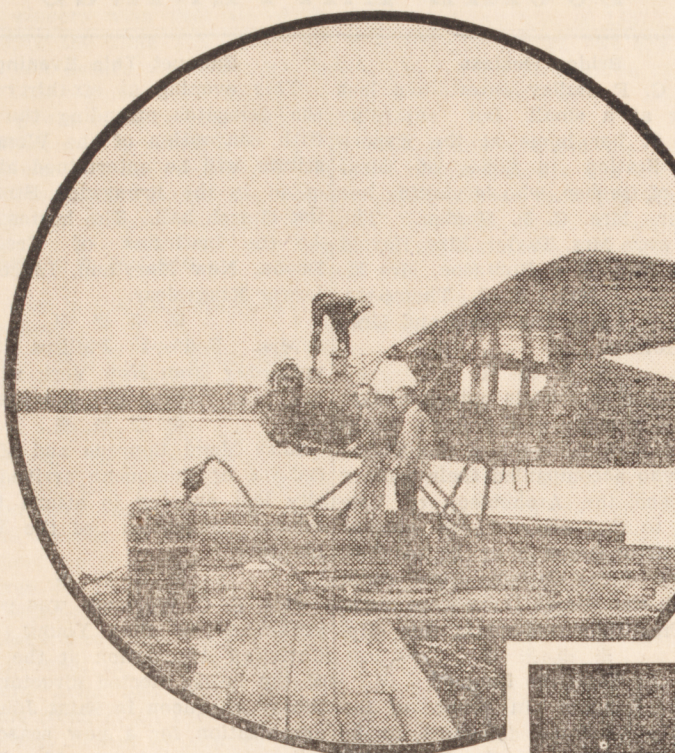

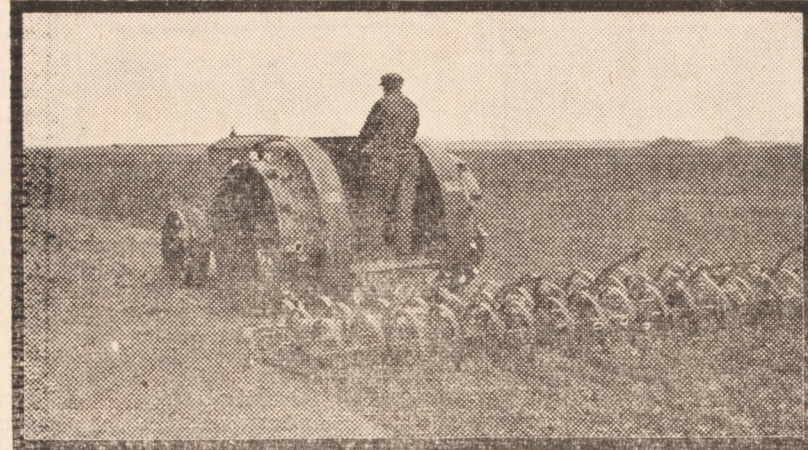

Jesse Owens Runs 100 in 9.3 Secs.

MADISON, Wis., May 20—Jesse Owens, of Ohio State University, bettered the world's record in the 100-yard dash Saturday, running it in 9.3 seconds in a dual track meet between Ohio State and the University of Wisconsin.

Owens beat by one-tenth of a second the previous record of 9.4 which he held jointly with George Simpson, of Ohio State.

The Buckeye Negro star ran with a stiff wind at his back, however, and the new mark probably will not be officially recognized.
