



OTTAWA, Dec. 24-The vast "blue" network of the National Broadcasting Company in the United States will bring to listeners in that country Canada's Christmas broadcast on Dec. 25. The programme, to be known as "Canada Broadcasts Christmas," will be presented at 4 p.m., EST, by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and will be a kaleidoscopic view of activities throughout the Dominion and a picturization of how citizens are spending the day.

The announcement that NBC would carry this hour-long programme was made today. It has been estimated that, with the combined networks of this system and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporaion, there will be a listening audience of thirty million people. The wire line facilities to be used by these networks will be sufficient to go around the world many times.


