## Garden Tools Improving

accompanying. Useful, too, are indestructible plant labels, paper seedling pots, and paper plant bands to protect seedlings from cutworms.

Perhaps spiked weeding gloves are a special need of the woman gardener, or shears that both clip and hold a flower; easy wall fasteners, too, for vines or roses, and a brass-nosed dibble for transplanting. A great convenience is a bulb planter and setter for early Spring bulbs. A long-nosed, non-splashing watering can is needed to reach the middle of a wide seed bed.

For better lawns there is a two-purpose lawn sprinkler that emits both water and plant food, while for ease in moving it about to any spot in the garden there is a four-wheeled sprinkler, its skeletonized frame holding a three-foot galvanized pipe that will throw a wide spray. It would seem that every garden need had been anticipated with better-made more convenient, more useful tools.

And sportiveness and sneezes.

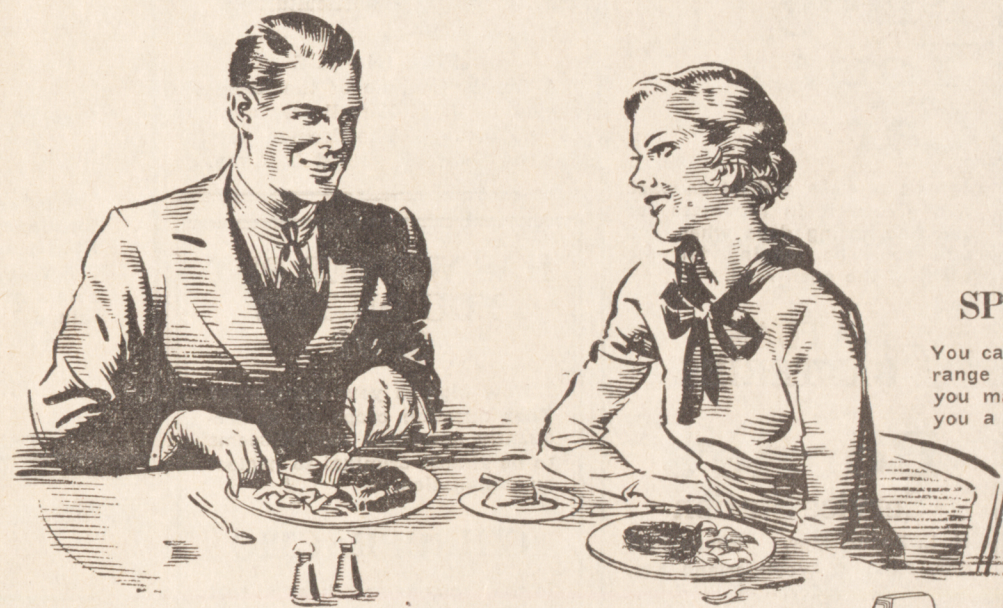
