Interesting Experiment in Egg Production

(Continued from Page Eight) point On a recent day this battery of twelve hens, each in separate compartments laid a total of 14 eggs, and on another day together laid 13 eggs. They regularly lay more than any other twelve hens at the Experimental Station, Mr. Bailey states. The present experiment has been carried on from November 1 to October 31, a period of one year.

Similar experiments are carried on at other experimental stations with the same satisfactory results from the standpoint of more output. In their steel frame cages the hens are without exercise though they have access to water and food. The ordinary practice has been to allow hens all the freedom of space they want.




