Recently Discussed

"A recent conference of the Permanent Committee on Highway Transportation, at which practically all the provinces were represented, was held at Ottawa, where the problems of motor transportation of goods and passengers for hire in the respective provinces, realized as one of our largest public utilities, was considered, and the report of that committee is interesting. It is realized by all those interested in the subject that the regulation of motor passenger busses can be more easily regulated than that of trucks carrying goods, wherein in some provinces a classification is made of trucks operating as private carriers and trucks operating as public carriers, and wherein in all cases the safety of life and property should be adequately protected by insurance."
