Exams End on Tuesday, Encaenial Exercises On Thursday

Encaenia Week at the University of New Brunswick will begin tomorrow morning, with the baccalaureate procession and sermon, the latter to be delivered this year by Rev. Dr. George E. Ross, minister of the St. Andrew's Presbyterian church.

The members of the graduating class this year will gather at the intersection of Brunswick and Carleton streets tomorrow morning, form a procession and march from there to the church. The procession will be headed by Dr. Jones, president of the University of New Brunswick, and other educational officials. The graduating class will be dressed in their traditional long gown and hat.

Examinations at the University which have been going on for the past week will finish on Tuesday. On Wednesday the University of New Brunswick Senate will meet and on Thursday the encaenial exercises will take place in the main building. His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, Dr. Murray MacLaren will be present and will present prizes and honor certificates. The encaenial exercises will be featured by the address to the graduating class by Hon. A. A. Dysart, premier of the province and the Alumni Oration to be delivered by Hon. Justice Harrison. Robert L. Armstrong of Barker's Point will deliver the valedictory. In the evening the annual encaenial dance will be held.

LIQUOR STORES OPEN EVENINGS THROUGHOUT N.B.

Local Store to Remain Open Evenings Until 9.30

Regulation Monday

This is For Convenience of People Employed All Day

The hours in which liquor may be procured in the various stores of the Liquor Control Board throughout the province have been increased. In the one-man stores the hours in future will be from nine o'clock a.m. to eight o'clock p.m. In the larger stores such as Fredericton those in need of liquid refreshments for medicinal or other purposes can buy their supply any time between 9 o'clock in the morning and 9.30 in the evening. Previously the hours at which the Fredericton store was open was from 9 o'clock until 5.30 on every week day except Saturday when they closed a half hour earlier.

The closing of the local liquor store at five o'clock or so has proved to be of considerable inconvenience to the general public who were engaged in stores, offices and other places up to between five and six o'clock and were unable to make contact with the store before that hour. Another inconvenience was to the tourist travel. These people arriving late in the afternoon, especially on Saturday evenings, were entirely unable to procure a wee drop to carry them overnight or over Sunday. One man said that the way the liquor store had been conducted previous to this was like locking a hungry man in a restaurant and then putting a muzzle on him. In Saint John there is a delivery system by which a person may telephone to a liquor store and have his liquor delivered.

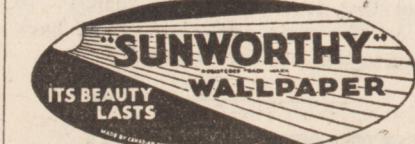
