IN CANADA POLIOMYELITIS CAN BE CHECKED IN EARLY STAGE

The though for parents then is that when there is any infantile paralysis in the district and the child has any suspicious symptoms the family doctor should be called at once. Eearly treatment may save life and prevent crippling paralysis.

If the serum to prevent infantile paralysis is used before the paralysis stage sets in, paralysis is prevented in most cases. And the use of the serum at any stage may be of help, and cannot do harm.
