Got 24-lb. Bull Salmon

Man, Fish Battled Into Darkness at Hartt's Island Pool

Charles A. Campbell of Wall St., New York and New Brunswick, New Jersey, war veteran and stock broker, bobbed into the limelight yesterday as a contender for the silver trophy awarded annually by the New Brunswick Guides' Association to the non-resident angler catching the largest salmon on the unleased waters of the province with the assistance of a registered guide. While casting from a canoe at the Hartt's Island pool at six o'clock last evening with Raymond Currie of this city as guide Mr. Campbell hooked a twenty-four pound hook-bill or bull salmon and brought it to the gaff after a strenuous battle which lasted over two hours. Darkness settled upon the earth while the battle raged, but a fishery guardian from a position on the western shore of the river procured a flashlight and paddled over to the island, where the big fish was making a game struggle for freedom, and assisted the angler in landing it.
