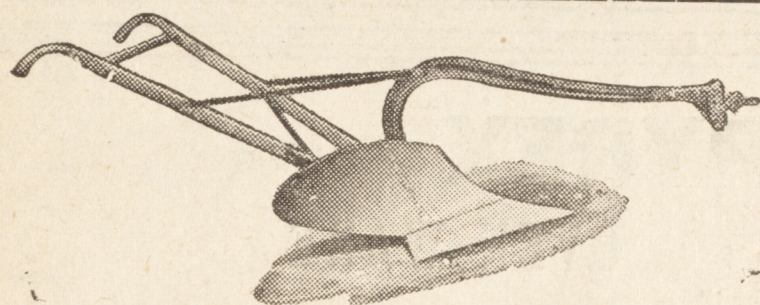

PLATTER BITS FOR EVENING PARTIES

A Little Bit of Something Different When You Entertain

If you are in search of unusual refreshments for evening affairs, vary the usual platter of cheese and crackers by spreading one cake of cream cheese with orange marmalade, topping it with another mound of cream cheese. Place this on the centre of a platter, pour over it more marmalade and surround with crisp crackers and whole wheat toast triangles and serve with hot coffee.

Scrambled eggs, with ham waffles, ripe plum jam and coffee is a delectable combination, and a tomato rabbit served with stuffed celery and pickles and finished off with a rich steamed spice or fudge pudding with foamy sauce and coffee will please everyone.

If you are very clever about concocting souffles, make your next one, cheese, and serve it with tomato sandwiches and a dessert of rich butterscotch tarts topped with whipped cream and coffee.

Venison Jelly

1 peck wild grapes
1 quart vinegar
½ cup whole cloves
½ cup stick cinnamon
6 pounds sugar

Put first four ingredients into preserving kettle, heat slowly to boiling, and cook until grapes are soft. Strain through double thickness of cheesecloth or a jelly bag, and boil liquid 20 minutes, then add sugar, heated and boil five minutes. Turn into glasses.

Pickled Lime Marmalade

12 medium green tomatoes
12 selected pickled limes
6 cups sugar

Wine tomatoes and drain limes then force through food chopper. Add sugar, bring to boiling point, and simmer three hours. Turn into glass jars and seal.

"Good Spirits" Punch

2 cups hot tea
2 cups sugar
1 cup lemon juice
2 cups orange juice
2 cups cider
7 cups boiling water
24 marshmallows

Prepare the tea by pouring two cups boiling water over four teaspoons of tea. Let stand from 3 to 4 minutes. Strain, add the sugar and stir until dissolved. Keep hot while bringing the fruit juices and cider

just to the boiling point, do not boil. Combine tea, hot juices, and boiling water. Serve at once while hot.

On each cup of punch, float a marshmallow (a ghost) on which goblin faces have been drawn with a toothpick dipped in red food coloring.

To Make Sauerkraut

Take off outer leaves of 20 large cabbages, quarter them and remove stalks. Slice very thin with a slicer, mix well with half pound salt. A tablespoon of caraway and a tablespoon of dill seed may be added if desired.

Line the bottom of a wooden keg or barrel with cabbage leaves. Put in a layer of sliced cabbage and pound with a wooden masher or mallet until liquid comes out. Repeat until all cabbage is used. Cover top layer with cabbage leaves, then with a wet cloth. Fit a wooden cover inside barrel and weight it down. Set in warm place for eight days to ferment. Then store in a cold but not freezing room. Every time kraut is taken out, smooth the top and put a clean wet cloth over it.

Pear Harlequin

Peel and cut up ½ peck pears, not too ripe, into thin slices, add two oranges, rind and all, cut up fine, add the contents of a medium sized can of grated pineapple. Weigh this mixture, add 2-3 of its weight of sugar and let stand over night. In the morning add one large or three small bottles of maraschino cherries, cut up and their juice. Cook until pears are clear and soft. Pour into sterilized jars and seal.

Cottage Cheese and Carrot Salad

1 package aspic gelatin
1 cup boiling water
¼ teaspoon salt
1 cup cold water
1 tablespoon scraped onion
½ cup chopped cabbage
½ cup chopped celery
¼ cup grated carrot

Dissolve salad aspic gelatin in boiling water, add salt and cold water, vinegar, salt and onion. Chill until it begins to thicken, add remaining ingredients, and mix well. Pour into ring molds and chill until firm. Unmold and fill centre of ring with cut salad greens, lettuce, chloery, cndive, watercress or raw spinach, mixed lightly with French dressing.

HAT'S SUCCESS BEGINS IN BACK

It Won't Look Good With Hair Worn Too Low On a Short Neck

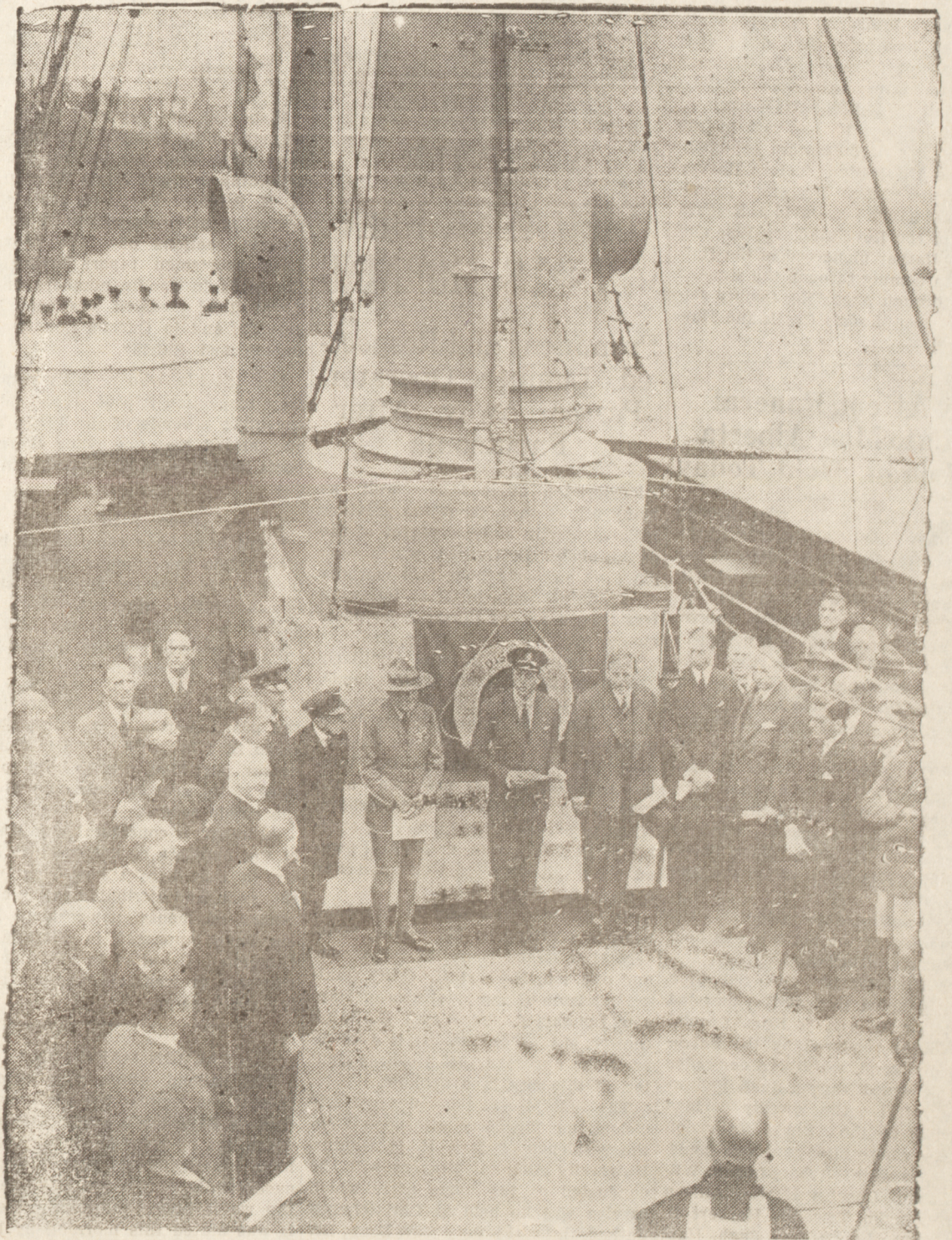
