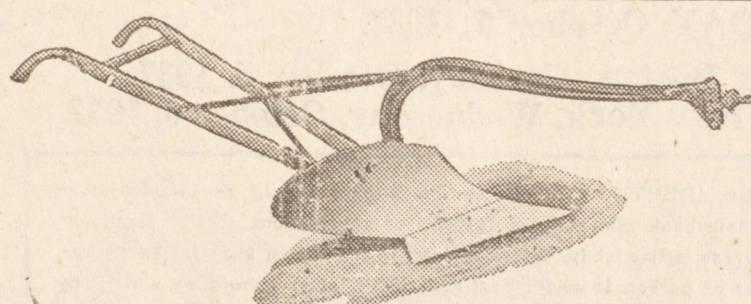

Interest to Women**FLOWER GROWING IN WINTER TIME****Blossoms Can Be Kept in the House**
Through Cold Weather

When the last flowers of the late fall have faded away, it is possible to have flowers in the home for several weeks during the winter months. The cost is nominal and the effort small. These blooms can be provided by bulbs in a large variety of color. To get the bulbs to flower successfully, it is necessary to start them for several weeks in darkness in a cool cellar. The bulbs themselves must be of good quality. A good plan is to buy them early in the season when they are likely to be more vigorous than those which have been lying about the store for several weeks. Good bulbs should be firm to the touch; heavy in comparison to their size according to their variety.

The bulbs should be potted as soon as they can be obtained from the seed store or dealer. By removing the pots from the cellar, after the bulbs have taken root, a succession of blooms can be obtained over a long period, at intervals of ten days or two weeks. Some bulbs can be grown in water alone, others in prepared peat, and still others in soil. The varieties that do best in water are Paper White Narcissus, Chinese Sacred Lily, and Hyacinths. The first two are grown in bowls and the bulbs kept in place by small stones.

EAT PEACHES AND LIVE LONG,
IF YOU GO IN FOR LEGENDFruit Which Originated in Persia the Emblem of
Longevity in China — Nice in Fritters"A little peach in an orchard grew—
A little peach of emerald hue;
Warmed by the sun and wet by the dew, it grew."—Eugene Field.

Pliny in his "Natural History" says of the peach that "the very name in Latin whereby they are called Persica, doth evidently show that they were brought out of Persia first."

But Philadelphia is the centre of the peach belt of the United States, for New Jersey, Maryland, Delaware and Pennsylvania peaches are famous. If you would select a gracious gift let it be choice peaches, since the peach is the emblem of longevity in China. Plates and bowls on which the peach appear make idea birthday gifts with this symbolism, in mind. You find Chinese and Japanese makers of porcelain use it much in their decorative scheme.

Yum, Yum! Fritters!

Peach fritters on the Pennsylvania Dutch menu, if we can spell it correctly, is Parsching Ponakucka: Cream 1-3 cup of butter and 1/2 cup of sugar and add two well beaten eggs Sift two cups of flour, three teaspoons of baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon of salt and add to the creamed mixture with one cup of milk. Fold about two cups of peaches into the mixture and add 1/2 teaspoon of lemon juice and 1/2 tea spoon of vanilla. The batter is then dropped into hot fat and fried until brown. They are served with whipped cream and powdered sugar.

Frozen peach and nut salad: Mix one cup of whipped cream, one cup of mayonnaise, one cup of cream cheese and a cup of nuts. Pour this mixture over the peaches in the tray or an ice box and freeze for several hours. Delicious served on a crisp leaf of lettuce.

Baked peaches: Peel, remove the stones and cut in half. Then place in a shallow baking pan and fill each cavity with sugar, 1/2 teaspoon butter, a drop or two of lemon juice, grate a bit of nutmeg on the top and after baking 20 minutes in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F., serve on buttered dry toast cut circular.

Sliced peaches and cream after the peaches have been chilled makes a quick and easy to prepare dessert.

A suggestion to the cook—To prevent fruit juices running over the edge of pies when making, sprinkle a bit of carbonate of soda over the fruit before top crust is put on the pie.

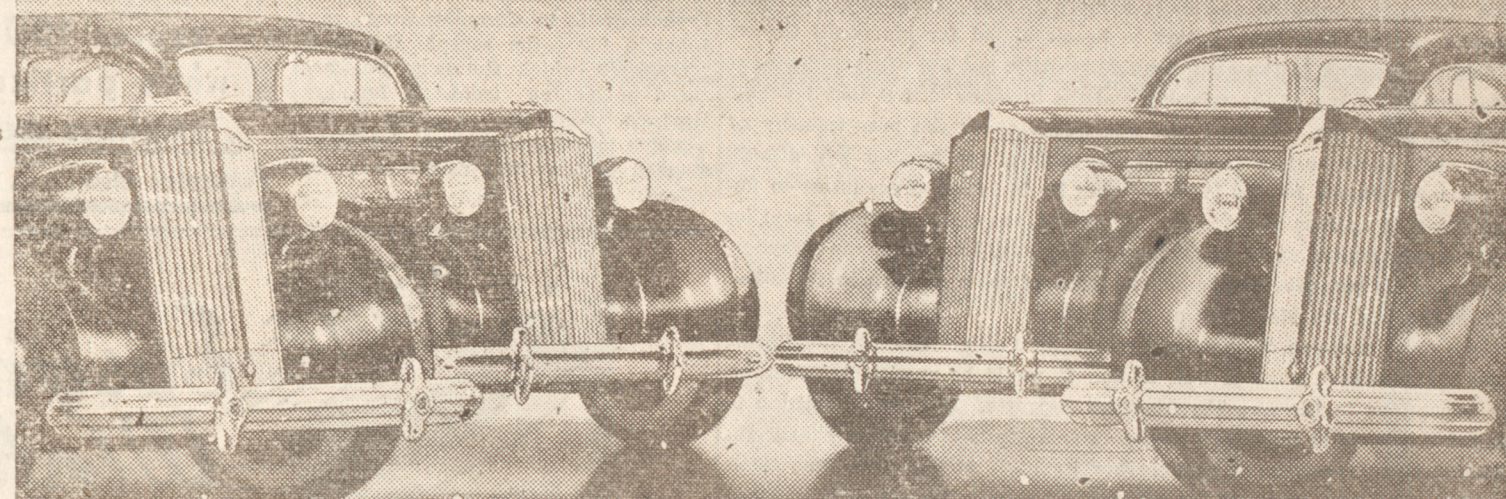
