The speaker for the afternoon exercises was Rev. Dr. J. W. Bartlett.

The programme opened with a drill on the Flag of the Empire, the pupils showing the results of careful training in the exactitude of their answers, after which there was a salute of the Flag and the National Anthem.

Mrs. C. D. Richards then in a pleasing address presented a library to the school. Mrs. F. C. Johnson presented the I.O.O.E. buttons awarded to each pupil who has read ten or more of the library books during the year. Mrs. Johnson encouraged the pupils to continue the habit of reading books, especially those dealing with the British Empire, also stressed loyalty to this great Empire, but advised against criticism and contempt for other nations whose forms of government, laws and religions differ from ours.

Rev. Dr. Bartlett gave an interesting and instructive address, stressing the points, Knowledge of the Empire, Love of the Empire as symbolized in their most Gracious Majesties, and Service to their Empire. The exercises closed with the Coronation Hymn and the National Anthem.
