

COMMUNISM IS INCREASING DANGEROUSLY IN THE DOMINION - BE ON YOUR GUARD

Linking Duke of Kent With York County Resident

Paul Gellibrand, Whose Daughter is Mixed Up in English Scandal, Lived at Springhill May Surpass Simpson Case Duke of Kent Mixed Up With Gossip Including Gellibrand Girl, Now Mrs. Allen

About forty years ago an Englishman, named Paul Gellibrand, came here and conducted a stock farm at Springhill on what is now the Murray farm, owned by Councillor John Doherty. Mr. Gellibrand during his residence here, married Miss Belle Dever, daughter of the late Senator and Mrs. James Dever of Saint John. Frederickton and Springhill through this connection are directly drawn into a situation which may even surpass the King Edward-Mrs. Simpson case for publicity of the British royalty. A sensational editorial appears in the London Evening Standard and connects the Duke of Kent with the beautiful Mrs. William Allen, and she was formerly Paula Gellibrand and a daughter of the man who conducted the Springhill stock farm. Her mother the former Belle Dever moved to London after leaving here, and in London the famous beauty, Paula, was born. Paula grew to be a raving beauty and as a mannequin was the toast of London a few years ago. She was one of the leading lights in the much-talked of gay set which moved about the Prince of Wales as he was at that time. She married the Marquis de Casa Maury, an Italian nobleman, obtaining a divorce from him some four or five years ago to marry William Allen, a Scot. A flood of anonymous letters charging an illicit romance between the Duke of Kent and Mrs. Allen have poured into newspaper offices following the recent account of the Duke of Kent's visit to a phrenologist in the company of Mrs. Allen. Mrs. Allen is 38 years of age, and is a world famous figure because of her physical charms. Mrs. Norman Leslie of Kingston, Ontario, is a sister of Mrs. Allen's mother, Mrs. Gellibrand, and therefore, an aunt of themuch discussed Mrs. Allen. The Devers are very well known in Saint John, although no members of the family live there now. Mr. Gellibrand came out to this country from Europe, taking up farming near Springhill, N. B., he married Miss Dever in Saint John, taking his bride to England after the ceremony. The daughter Paula, has never been in this country. (Continued on Page Four)

KIDNAPPING OF GEN. CHIANG WAS RUSE TO MOVE TROOPS

Japanese Fooled by Apparent Internal Trouble in China Made No Move to Check Military Activities (By Dewitt Mackenzie) NEW YORK, Jan. 21—From New York's Chinatown comes a theory that the sensational kidnapping of the Chinese generalissimo was a ruse to deceive Japan and to permit Chiang Kai-Shek to move troops in an effort to offset aggression against China's northern provinces. Chiang Kai-Shek was seized by powerful Marshal Chang Hsueh-Liang in an advertised attempt to force China into war with Japan. The circumstances of Chiang's release were as astonishing as his kidnapping. One of America's leading Chinese businessmen, who maintains a close contact with China, says that the whole thing was a put-up job between Chiang and his subordinate, to enable the generalissimo to pursue plans to combat Mongol aggression—supported by Japan and Manchukuo—against China's northern provinces. Our Chinese merchant, who gave his views over the dinner table in a secluded spot in Chinatown—which is pretty mysterious in itself, says that Chiang resorted to this ruse in order to move troops northward over the energetic protests of Japan. Dangers of Communism

PEOPLE of Canada may not be aware that Communist influence, propaganda, and doctrine are stronger right here in Canada than in any other country in North America, outside of Mexico. While we in this section of the Dominion feel a false sense of security, and say Communism can never get a foothold or gain any strength amongst us, let us not deceive ourselves in this matter. The Communist works in a very insidious and subtle manner, entrapping those who fall for its teachings almost before they are aware of the danger. To give some idea of its influence and growth in Canada, let us view the results of the recent elections in the city of Toronto held in December last. In that election, Tim Buck, Canada's leading Communist, received 31,426 votes, or nearly one out of every three votes polled. Realize this result, with the vote received by Earl Browder, the Communist candidate in the city of New York, receiving only 32,000 votes in a city of many millions, while the city of Toronto is barely three-quarters of a million in population. Realize that in the British general elections of 1935 out of 29,500,000 votes, the total Communist vote polled was only 27,117 votes, and Tim Buck polls 31,426 votes in the city of Toronto, which boasts of its strong adherence to British traditions, and is so proud of its Imperial connections. And yet Toronto is today one of the most Communist cities in either the United States or Canada, and is the heart and mainspring and source of Communist activities for the whole of Canada. While Tim Buck was not elected a controller in Toronto, Communist history was written in Canada in that election, for Stewart Smith, a graduate of a Red school, an out-and-out Communist, was elected alderman. A Communist editor was elected to the Board of Education; another, Deputy Reeve of York Township; another, a Councillor in Scarborough. What does all this mean? It means that in the city of Toronto alone, and its suburbs, the Communist party in Canada polled as many votes as the whole Communist vote in the United States Presidential election. It means the influence and doctrines of Communism are stronger in this part of Canada than any other part of North America. Men and women throughout all Canada should awaken to the danger surrounding them by the spread of this menace of civilization. A disruptive organization that seeks to ruin our country and our homes, even denies the existence of a God, and places men and women on the same level as the animal, since without a belief in God, man has no moral responsibility to his Creator or to his fellow man. Just as surely as Communism has become such a force in Ontario, so will it, eventually, unless strong methods are immediately adopted, spread to other part of Canada; for the Communist overlooks no ground that might appear as good soil to sow the seeds of their godless doctrines. Strongly organized as it is, it is only by organized effort that it will be possible to combat it. The Knights of Columbus in America have already launched a campaign against this and other modern evils, known as the Knights' Crusade, in an effort to retard and check the growth of this greatest of modern evils. This Crusade is not for the protection of any particular creed or class, but a campaign for the general welfare of every class of people, and every man, woman and child who professes Christianity. In such a cause, no man or woman can remain neutral. It's a fight between Communism and Christianity. On which side will you stand?

SOCIAL CREDIT BILL PREPARED IN ALBERTA LINDBERGH'S PLAN TO BE BRITISH IS REPORT

EDMONTON, Jan. 21—Legislation to introduce a social credit financial system in Alberta will be drafted in the next few weeks and reviewed by a Government caucus before the Legislature opens Feb. 25. Premier William Aberhart made this announcement yesterday at the first Province-wide convention of the Social Credit League, the political organization behind the Alberta Government. His announcement strengthened reports the Government caucus, which closed yesterday, accepted, at least in part, the eleven-point social credit plan recommended by a Cabinet committee. Time Needed Premier Aberhart told the convention he was convinced social credit would be operated in Alberta. But there must be time to draft a work (Continued on Page Four)

TRADE PACT REVISION READY FOR SIGNATURE

Concessions Made to U.K. Are Expected to Satisfy Even Lancashire and Yorkshire Textile Interests. OTTAWA, Jan. 21—Neither the Dominion Government nor Sir Francis Floud, High Commissioner for the United Kingdom in Canada, has been advised that it is the intention of Rt. Hon. Walter Runciman, President of the British Board of Trade, to visit Ottawa. Mr. Runciman, an ardent low-tariff man, was one of the outstanding figures at the Imperial Economic Conference held here in 1932. He is visiting New York and Washington in connection with an Anglo-American trade agreement. It has been suggested that he was to come here to remove snags in connection with the new Anglo-Canadian trade agreement, but if that is the case there is no need for his good offices. FURTHER DETAILS FROM DISCOVERY NUMBER TWO

The ship Discovery was on a mission of observation and after their motor engine stalling were out at sea for five days when the boat sank. They spent the next five days on the beach and were discovered by searchers two days ago. Berlin and Rome to Fight Institution of Bolshevism in Spain

Pact Between Italy and Germany Reported Tightened Portugal Acts Anglo-French Stand is Reason For the Change Of Front ROME, Jan. 21—Italy has abandoned the idea of a four-power pact with Germany, Great Britain and France, well-informed persons said today in Rome. They gave these reason for the decision: 1. The tension over Spain is too great. 2. France is unwilling to part with her Soviet alliance. 3. Britain has reacted unfavorably to tentative feelers on such a pact. Virginio Gayda, the authoritative Fascist writer, sounded the death knell of the four-power idea in Giornale D'Italia. He said the positions of "some signatories" to the old Locarno agreement were "almost radically changed, owing to the new undertakings they have assumed," and added: Hold Joint Accord "Italy has no intention of returning to a four-power pact." Instead, Germany and Italy will hold to a joint accord "against the institution of Bolshevism in Spain," with, according to Reich Air Minister Hermann Goering, a determination to keep it out of Western Europe "at any cost." Referring to his series of conferences with Premier Mussolini and Count Galeazzo Ciano Foreign Minister, Goering asserted: "I am glad to say a complete accord has been reached with Il Duce and Ciano on all subjects discussed. The axis of 'Rome-Berlin' will be a solid base for constructive peace in Europe." The harmony of the two governments, Chancellor Hitler's chief aid told the Italian press, will be reinforced in the immediate future "with tight and continuous contracts" on all problems. A Government official restated the Italian and German position is non-intervention in the Spanish civil war with the assertion they would accept control of volunteers, but would con (Continued on Page Four)

Cuban Duty on Potatoes Cancelled

(Special to The Daily Mail) FLORENCEVILLE, N.B., Jan. 21—A. D. McCain, who has been in communication with his broker, Mr. Arturo Armand, Havana, concerning the imposition of ten dollars per barrel on seed potato stock, the deposit to be posted by the purchaser to guarantee that seed potatoes were utilized for this purpose. Only today Mr. McCain received a cable from Mr. Armand in Havana that this duty was cancelled yesterday. This will be particularly welcome news to New Brunswick farmers who grow certified seed cobbles, Green Mountains and Bliss Triumph varieties for the Cuban market. The imposition of this guarantee would have worked great hardships on small potato importers and Cuban farmers, making the price prohibitive.

FLU EPIDEMIC SPREADS WEST

WINNIPEG, Jan. 20—An epidemic of a mild type of influenza, it became apparent tonight, is spreading through the northern sections of the Prairie provinces. Southern areas, reports indicated, were touched but lightly. From Edmonton, where visits of children to hospitals have been prohibited in an effort to prevent the outbreak from reaching epidemic proportions, the disease was traced through North Saskatchewan and Northern Manitoba. In Alberta, towns hardest hit were Camrose and Millet, in the Edmonton district. Schools were closed at both places, with three-quarters of Millet's population reported ill.
