OTTAWA, Nov. 18. - The Minister of Finance, Hon. Charles Dunning, will prove next session to have been a good prophet, as the \$35,000,000 deficit he predicted will be realized. OTTAWA, Nov. 17-An investigaion of Customs administration with particular reference to applications for drawbacks, examination or irrigation and prairie farm rehabilitation prospects, and a distinctive Canadian flag are urged in motions already submitted for the House of Commons order paper.




