They are Molded to Figure With Fabric's Grace

There's a new fabric, and it's fur. Fur so skillfully handled that it has all the dressmaker tricks of fabric to mold supple, lustrous skins into the slimmest, youngest lines that ever graced a fur coat.

Yoke effects, slenderizing tuxedo stoles, corded collars and shoulders, tucking and shirring—they're all done in the new fur coats.

It began at the openings in Paris. Only a glance proved that furs were perking up and taking a new interest in life, for there was more variety, more difference, and as much figure flattery as you'd get in your favorite dress.

Fur coats have silhouette—at last. Bulky, heavy fur is a thing of the past. Coats have fur where you need it most for warmth, but no surplus weight to carry around your neck in collars, awkward back fullness, or length.

Collars are snug at the throat and not a single icy wind can penetrate them, but they are small enough to look young and flattering, framing the face, not bundling you into shapelessness. Shoulders are tucked, and sometimes slightly padded.

Marvelous lines are done in fitted coats. Smooth bodice, nipped in waist and flared skirt with graceful rippled fullness that even velvet couldn't rival in beauty. And if there's any bulk anywhere in this hourglass silhouette, it's in the sleeves, where it is most practical, preventing straining, rips, and wear.

Bushy coats of red or silver fox—and some in Persian lamb—are made slim by applying the skins on soft suede or fabric, instead of sewing them together. You barely see the fabric between skins, yet it makes all the difference in the world. Just as rich in effect, but svelter in clinging curves.

Speaking of bushy furs—the newest coat of the season is the chubby short, straight and square in silhouette from the broadened shoulders to the end of the coat, usually fingertip length. Bulky only in cut—for the sake of chic—not in weight.

You've probably seen it already in skunk, and it's also high fashion in Australian opossum, a dressy sports fur that is soft and becoming near the face, and looks grand with wool dresses in bright colors.

Chubbies are so smart that they're being made even in ermine, youngest evening coat you ever saw, with an ermine bow or collar made of two rows of cording to snuggle under your chin. Silver fox, Persian lamb, kolinsky, mink, squirrel, raccoon—they're all rejuvenated in chubbies.

Colored Furs

In Paris, colored furs are the rage; violent green, red, blue and purple. As a result, there's also more chic in subdued 'colored' furs like the grays and browns.

Beaver is a high fashion fur again, especially in its new form, sheared to make it lighter and sleeker, and processed to keep it from curling after it has been wet. It is smart in boxy coats, not quite long, with slight fullness swinging from the shoulders in back. Modified swaggers, yet much straighter than the swaggers of the other years.

Nutria is another brown fur returned to fashion's favor. Everything gray is fashionable—Persian lamb, krimmer, caracul and squirrel.

Ombre furs are appearing—some that you didn't dream could look that way. There's an ombre Persian lamb, for instance, natural, that blends from smoky gray to black, effective in the matched skins. Ombre caracul is lovely in soft gray tones with just enough of the darker shades to be very slenderizing.

SOME FACTS ABOUT DIGESTION

Clearing Up Some Popular Misapprehensions About Some Of The Digestive Functions

Discussion waxed high the other day in regard to the digestibility of various foods. One person announced that fish was more quickly digested than meat and, therefore, better for the dinner of a brain worker who burned the midnight oil!

Actually both meat and fish digest as quickly as is necessary and so do most other foods, excepting in abnormal conditions. Of course, if either of these foods are fried and soaked with fat, digestion will be slower.

There seems to be a popular misapprehension in regard to the matter of rapid digestion. It happens that the digestive apparatus is well organized so that the work of digestion is pretty evenly divided. The saliva in the mouth starts the preparation of the starchy foods for absorption. Thoroughly mixed with saliva, the food goes on its way to the stomach in the upper part of which starch digestion continues. When the food meets the juices in the lower part of the stomach, the preparation of protein food is begun.

The intestines then take up the work and finish the digestion of starch and protein and act upon the fat so that the nutritive qualities may be ready to pass through the walls into the bloodstream.

That is the picture of normal digestion. Little thought need be given to it unless there is some individual problem such as too much or too little hydrochloric acid in stomach or unless intestinal digestion is abnormal.

Date Ginger Cake4 tablespoons fat
½ cup sugar
1 egg
½ cup sweet or sour milk
½ cup nuts
1 cup cut dates
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon ginger
½ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon soda
1½ cups flour

Cream the fat, add the sugar gradually, add the egg and beat well. Mix the molasses and the milk. Mix and sift dry ingredients, add alternately with the liquid to the creamed fat and sugar. Add nuts and dates. Bake in a moderate oven 30 to 45 minutes.

Spinach Ring½ peck spinach
2 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons flour
½ cup milk
3 eggs, separated
Pepper and salt
1 tablespoon grated onion
½ teaspoon nutmeg

Wash, pick over and cook spinach until tender, about ten minutes then drain and chop or put through meat grinder. Heat butter, stir in flour, then the milk. When smooth and thick, stir gradually into beaten egg yolks. Add spinach and seasonings, grated onion and nutmeg. Fold in the stiffly beaten whites of eggs and place in a well greased ring or mold, set in a pan half filled with boiling water; bake 20 minutes.
