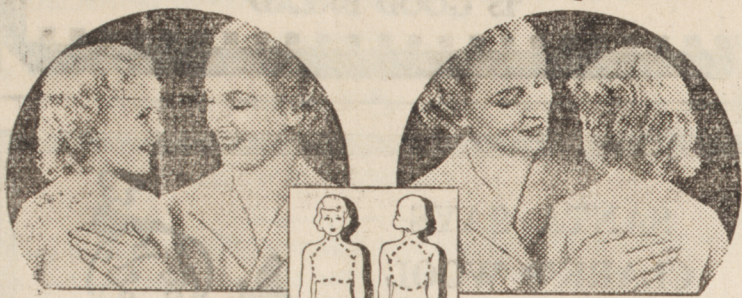

NEW MODEL BRITISH ARMY TANK TO STAND TEST ON SPEED CLAIM

WESTFIELD, N.J., Dec. 16—J. Walter Christie, 70 year old inventor, ran his hand lovingly along the steel top of an army tank today and said: "Here she is—the fastest land weapon anyone has ever seen. It's taken me five years and all my money to build her. I hope her only use is for peace."

Christie had brought the tank out to the Westfield airport, the most open bit of country available for a demonstration and official tests by the American Automobile Association, to prove his claim that it could travel 50 miles an hour over a field.

"She'd be awfully hard to stop," said the tall, thin man. "Look at her, only four feet high. It would be hard for field artillery to hit her at 200 yards if she were standing still—and with her speed and power, well—figure it out."

The tank he demonstrated, weighs about six tons. Its steel is 11-16 inch thick. It is powered with a 430 horsepower aviation motor. It can carry three or four men and a quick-firing field piece operating from the safety of its turret.

The tank was made under contract for Morris Industries, Ltd., the British manufacturing firm headed by Lord Nuffield. As an integral part of the British rearmament program, the

Christie tanks are to be turned out in England at the rate of two a day. "I could have sold them to some other countries," said Christie, "and maybe made money right off. But I don't want my tanks ever to be used for aggression. I'm getting to be an old man, and I never did have an awful lot of use for money. Just so my wife and I can get along, that's all I ask. I'm tired working now. I've done the very best I could, and I'm satisfied. That is my last tank."

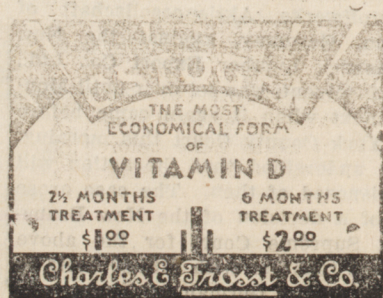

TABLE LIKENED TO THE B.N.A. ACT

Confederation Furniture In Need of Same Repair, Commission Is Told.

REGINA, Dec. 15—Five members of the Dominion-Provincial Relations sat today at the same table as the Fathers of Confederation sat around in 1864. Not one of those early makers of Canada now exists, but the table is still a sound and sturdy specimen of the best craftsmanship of 70 years ago.

Premier Patterson says it needs about the same percentage of renovation and repair as does the B.N.A. Act, which was well and truly laid in its main features at that period. The furniture is old-fashioned and the B.N.A. Act also "was based on a form of society and an idea of government which no longer exists."

When the Federal Government was moved to Ottawa, furniture went along, including this table. When the first Northwest Council was established, the Ottawa Government sent along this table. It was too large for the small offices of that day, and six feet of it were sawn off.

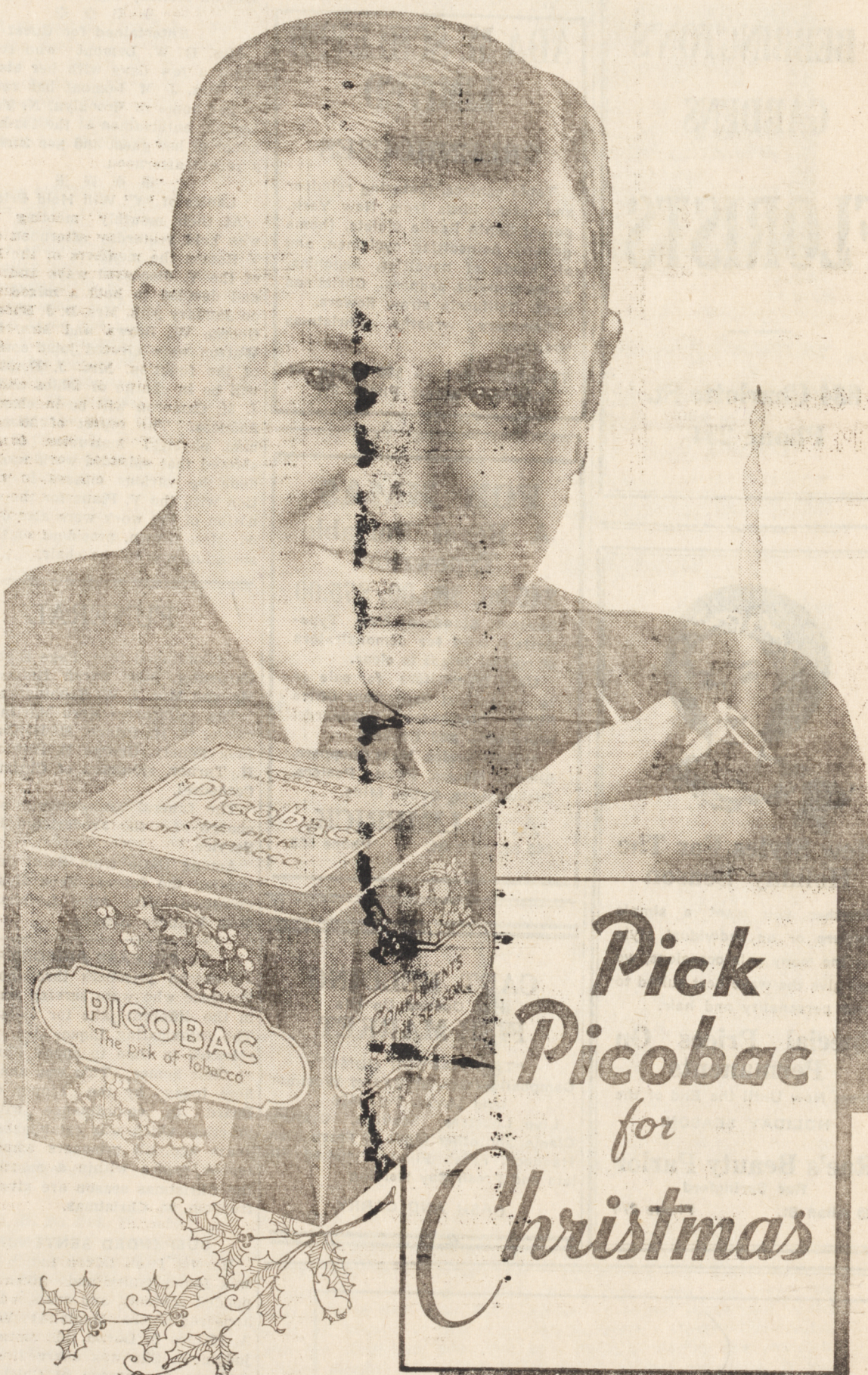
