## WAR IN AIR CONSIDERED UNLIKELY BY MOTOR MAGNATE FROM BRITAIN

QUEBEC, Nov. 13.—The next war, should one occur, will not be fought in the air as often predicted, in the opinion of Sir Percival Perry, Chairman of the Ford Motor Company of England and war-time British Munitions Ministry official.

In an interview Saturday aboard the liner Empress of Britain, Sir Percival pointed to the Spanish civil war as an example. "There," he said, "aircraft have not proved so successful. But that's just my opinion; why don't you ask H. G. Wells?" Sir Percival sailed for home after a visit to Canada and the United States.

Never having witnessed a similar incident before, they exposed several feet of film in broad daylight, using three cameras. In all of them the woman was prominently in view. ## HITLER LINES SITUATION UP FOR NEW COUP

Gets Italy Definitely In Anti-Red Front, Away From His First Love, a British Agreement

BERLIN, Nov. 13.—While the world's three great democracies—America, Great Britain and France—have taken the lead at the Brussels conference in an attempt to put an end to the developing aggressiveness of the "have not" nations, the latter have not lost time in tightening their ranks and organizing their resistance. Chancellor Adolf Hitler and Premier Benito Mussolini apparently have not left unnoticed President Roosevelt's speech calling for the defense of civilization against aggressor nations. They have decided that it is better to get together first and be prepared for an attack.

In Berlin diplomatic circles the impression prevails that President Roosevelt's speech and the calling of the Brussels conference prompted Chancellor Hitler to urge Premier Mussolini to join the German-Japanese anti-Communist pact signed here last November 5.

British Duce's Early Love  
Mussolini was reluctant to join this pact because he knew it would arouse the anger of Great Britain and the United States, and until recently his greatest wish has been to come to terms with Great Britain. But there is no doubt that he has been greatly disappointed by the failure of the League of Nations, in its second assembly since Italy's victory in Ethiopia, to recognize Italian Empire of Africa. Therefore Hitler was able to overcome the Duce's resistance to joining the German-Japanese front.

For Hitler, this is a concrete threat against Russia. Most diplomatic and military observers in Berlin and Rome believe that the anti-Communist pact has no military treaty attached to it, and that at present at least it does not mean that Germany, Japan and Italy will act together in case of war of one of the three powers against the Soviet. But Hitler is the bearer of the mystical idea of Germany's mission to save Europe and the world from Communism, and any state he wins to this idea means progress for him on the path to final victory.

Duce Firm On Reds, Too  
Mussolini is too great a realist and opportunist to follow Hitler in his ideology, but on one hand he is determined to chase Communism out of Spain and the Mediterranean, and on the other hand, it is difficult for him to refuse such satisfaction to Hitler after the great reception he had in Berlin six weeks ago.

Drawing Italy into the anti-Communist pact is not the only idea in which Hitler has been engrossed lately. He apparently is considering that too much time has passed since March 7, 1936, when German troops walked into the Rhine, without his giving another victory to his people.

The Versailles treaty has been openly repudiated by him, but some of its clauses are still in effect, and above all Germany has not yet recovered her colonies. It was easier to re-militarize Germany and re-occupy the Rhineland than to recover overseas possessions now in the hands of other powers, one of which is Japan. Yet Hitler is confident he will come out victorious on this question as on the others.

Formal Move Expected  
Reports have been current in Berlin that next week Der Fuehrer will call the Reichstag and take there a solemn declaration that Germany does not recognize any clauses drawn at Versailles, and that Japan and Italy will confirm this declaration by similar ones.

But so many rumors circulate in Berlin, where the press is muzzled and officials are tight-lipped, that it is difficult to give credence to them before they are confirmed by official statements. It is more likely that Hitler has not made definite plans yet, and that when he makes them he will act quickly and suddenly, as usual.

In any case, if it is true that Italy and Japan will support Germany and announce that they do not recognize the clauses of the Versailles treaty which place German colonies under League mandates, it will mean that the co-operation of the "have nots" has progressed far.

## Prophetic Curriculum Compilers Foresaw Milk-Price Jump

EAST YORK, Nov. 12.—A touch of humor was injected into the milk controversy today by a member of the East York Board of Education. Perusing a copy of the new arithmetic text being used in the revised curriculum, the trustee suddenly stopped reading and exclaimed:

"So the Government knew all about the pending rise in the price of milk". And to his bewildered colleagues he quoted a section of a lesson from the text:

"As the price of milk is fourteen cents a quart how many...?"

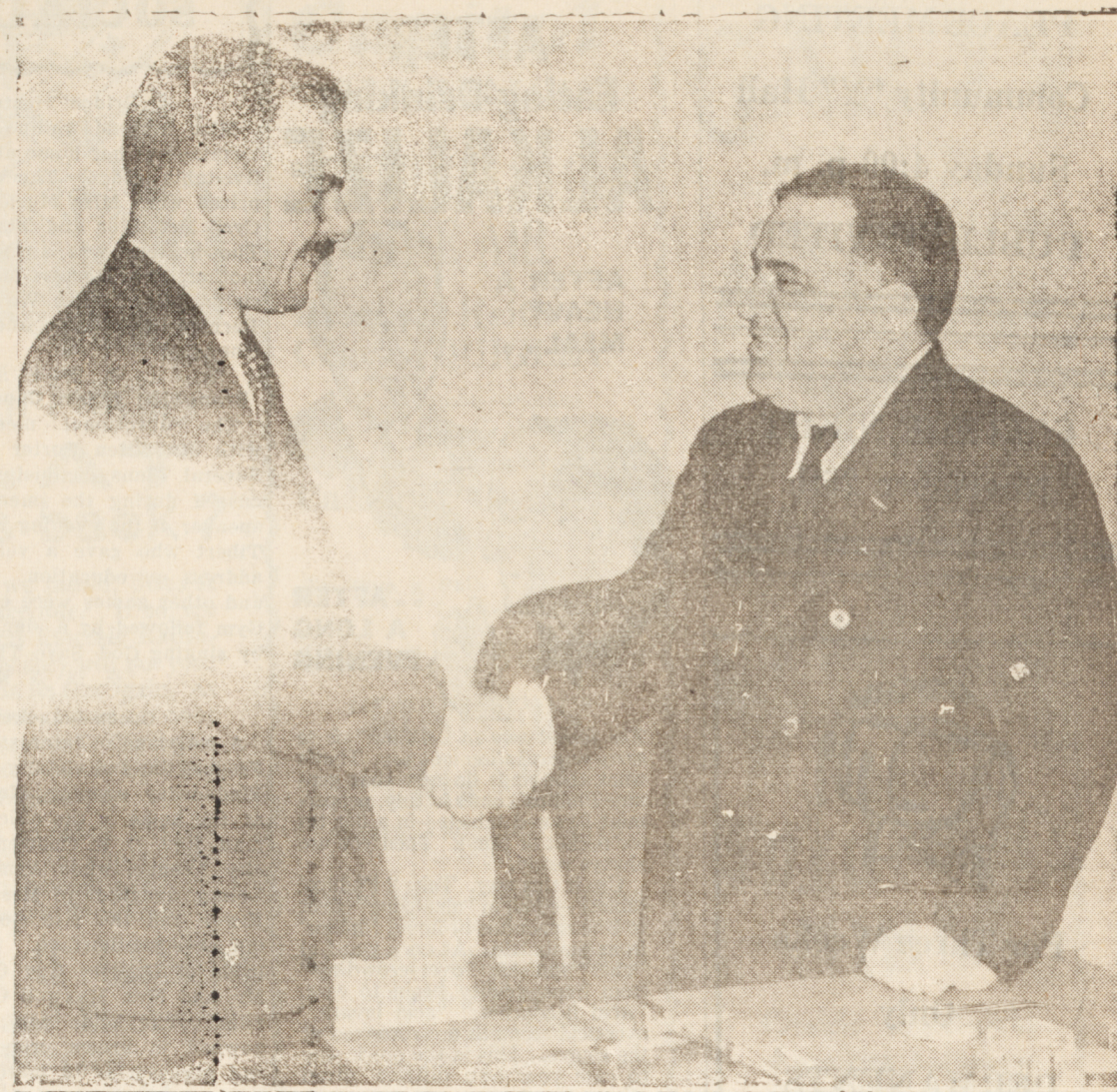
